1) COLLEGE BOARD MEETINGS

1. At its inaugural meeting of February 28th, the new College Board elected the following for 1978/80:

J.C.M. Scott - Chairman J.M. Kennedy - Vice-Chairman

Campus/Centre liaison Board members were named as well; ours is J. Baker, who has served on the College Council/Board for a number of years and was elected a Vancouver School Board trustee in December.

- 2. In regular session on Wednesday, March 14th, the College Board discussed, among others, the following matters:
 - a) The College Principal's report included a variety of items; a copy of the report has been placed in our library.
 - b) In response to a draft proposal from the Management Advisory Council respecting the establishment of criteria for the setting of priorities for capital projects, the Board approved for submission to M.A.C. its own criteria, with the hope and expectation that the M.A.C. document will be appropriately modified.

Also, as requested by M.A.C., the Board set priorities for our own capital proposal; these, too, will be submitted to the Management Advisory Council.

- c) The by-laws, approved some time ago by the College Council for implementation after the College was so designated by the Minister, were amended respecting tuition fees and then approved by the Board for submission to the Minister. The by-laws require the Minister's approval before they can finally be adopted by the Board.
- d) A variety of RACs (V.V.I. and C.E.) and a Special Project for Japanese students (C.E.) were approved.
- 3. Background material respecting the foregoing, as well as minutes of the previous two meetings have been placed in our library for the perusal of those interested.


