A bulletin is posted on the bulletin board near the letter boxes calling for nominations for recipients of the PACE Outstanding Contributions to Adult Education awards.

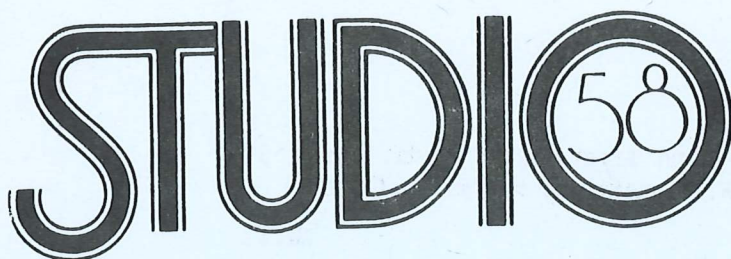

Please feel free to join us for this well-illustrated and often humorous account of modern physics.

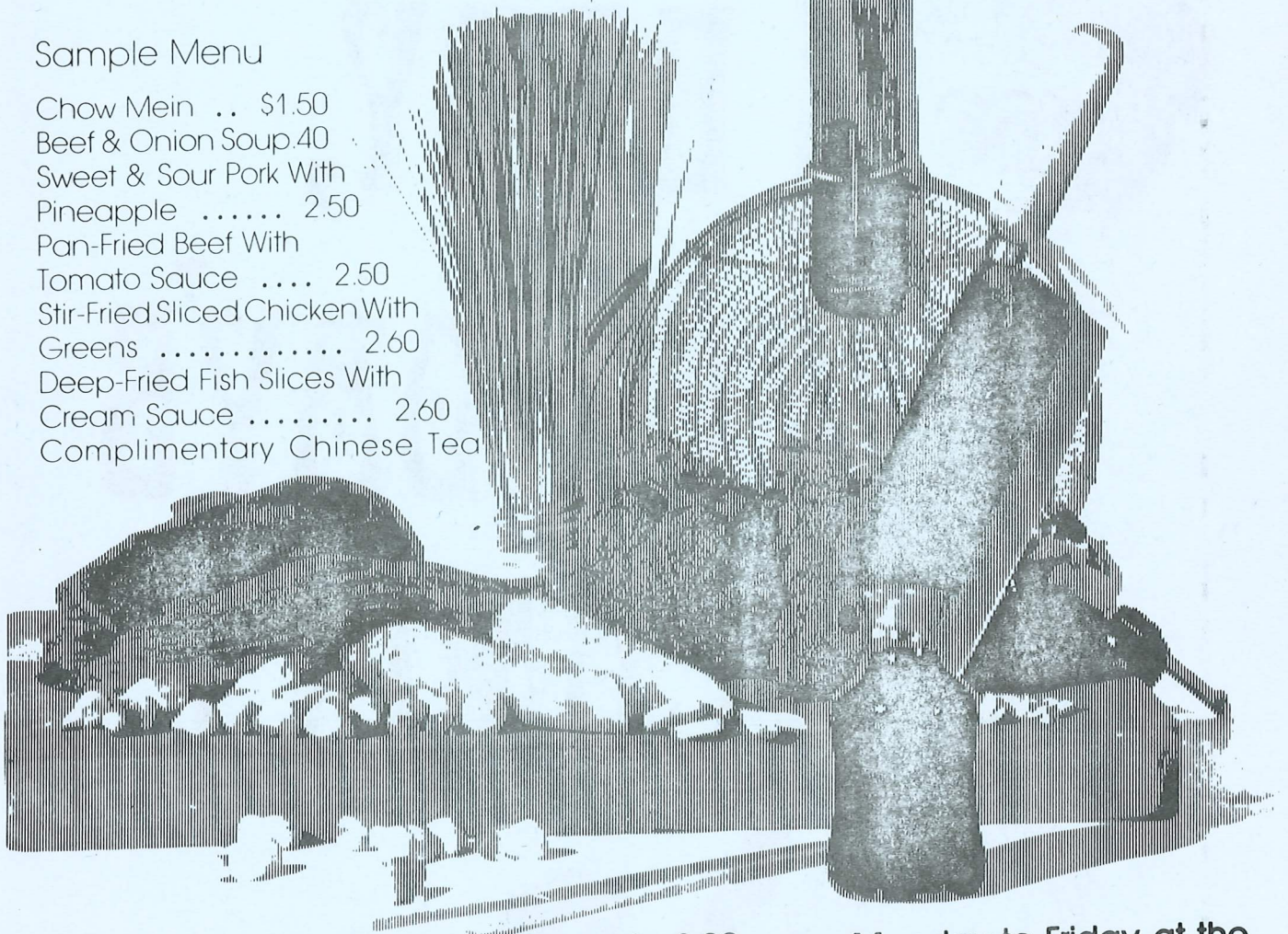

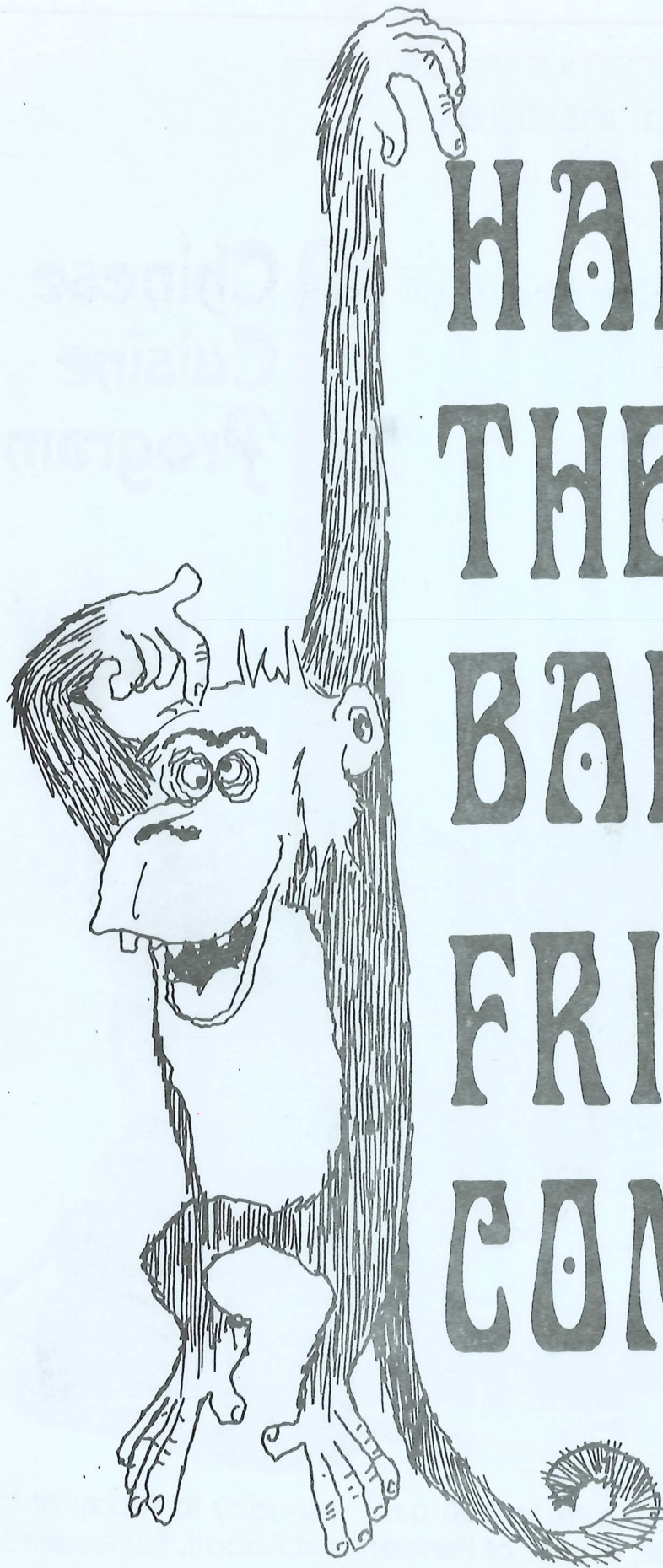
