

Dear Colleague:

I'm writing to inform you about opportunities for graduate study in adult education at the University of British Columbia. I've enclosed several copies of our flyer which can be posted or distributed to interested faculty members, and a copy of our detailed brochure for reference.

The Department of Adult Education has recently joined with two other Departments in a Division of Educational Administration, Adult, and Higher Education. This will increase our capability of meeting the needs of college and institute personnel for appropriate programs of graduate study.

We offer two master's degree programs (M.A. and M.Ed.) and one doctoral degree program (Ed.D.) as well as a Diploma in Adult Education. The Department has eight full-time faculty members and about 140 graduate students.

It might be of interest to your staff to know that is is now feasible to obtain a Master's degree through coursework taken in summer sessions. The doctoral program has a two-year residency requirement which can be met in various ways.

We will be offering three courses in summer session 1979, which runs from July 3 to August 10 - Introduction to Adult Education, Program Planning and Evaluation, and Educational Gerontology. Other departments in the Division will be offering such courses as The Regional, Junior or Community College, Current Developments in Higher Education, Basic Contributions to Administrative Thought, and Educational Finance.

If any of your staff members are interested in beginning a graduate program in adult education, right now would be a good time to apply so that the admission process can be completed in time to register for summer session. 




