Last week, May 31 and June 1, the Adult Basic Education Association of British Columbia held its first annual general meeting at Douglas College, Richmond Campus. Street certificate: Licence to solicit.

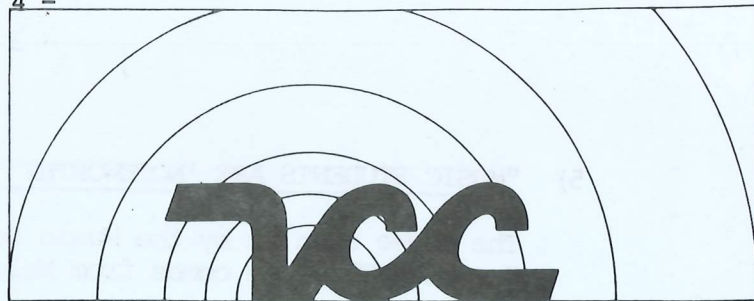

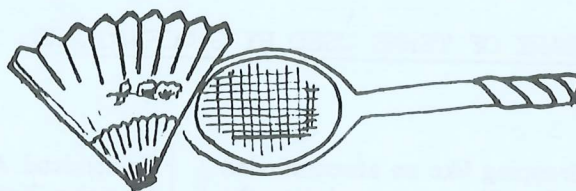

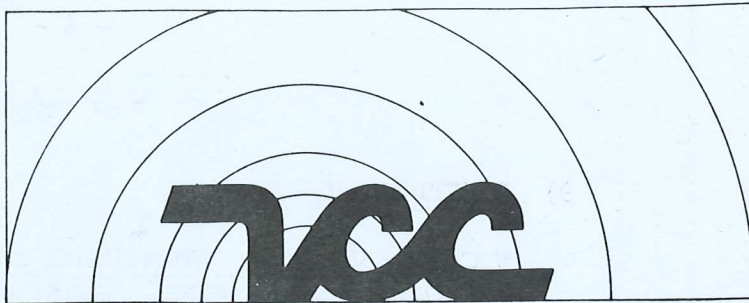

V.C.C. - Langara requires Librarian Audiovisual Materials and Services. Closing date for applications June 12, 1979.

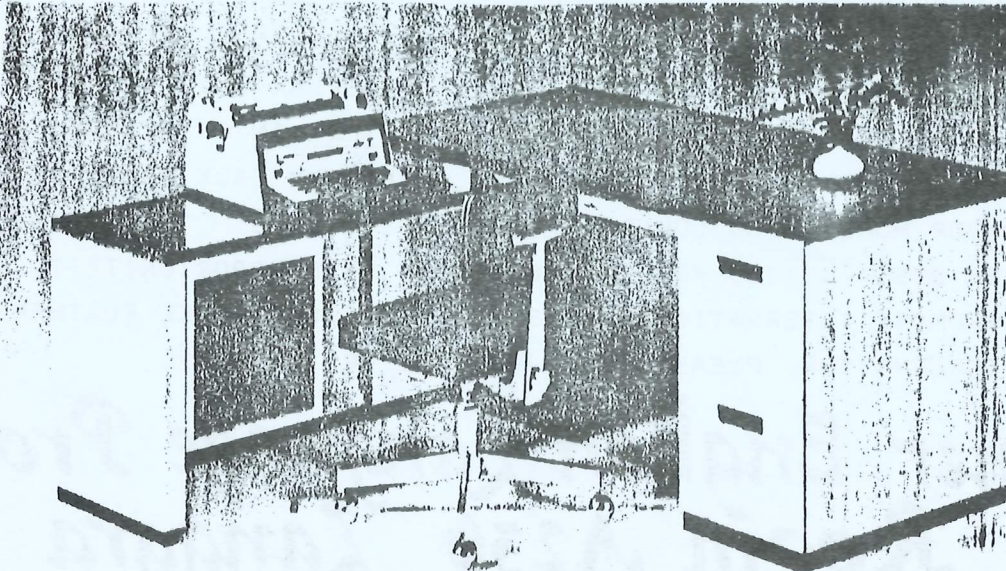
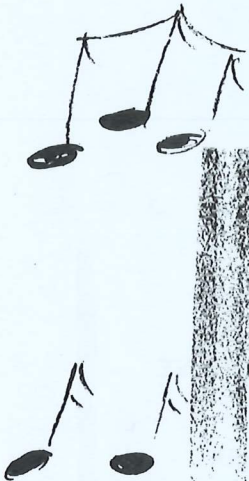
