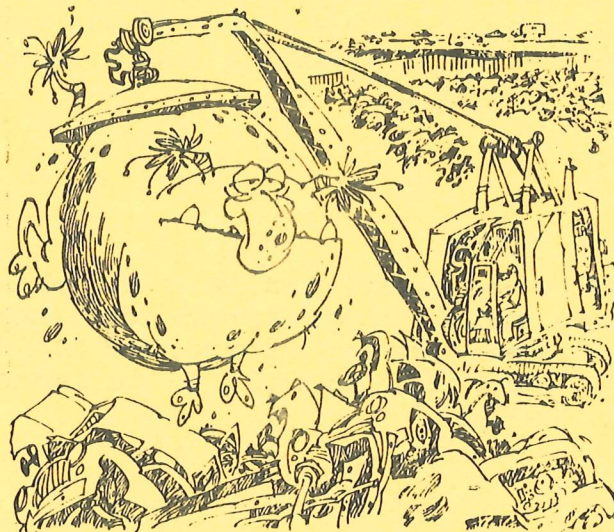

Scrapping A PROJECT

10) ENGLISH LANGUAGE TRAINING: HOMEFRONT LEARNING

The English Language Training Department requires a Head Teacher for its new innovative Homefront Learning Project.

The purpose of Homefront Learning is to seek out immigrants who need English Language training, but who cannot or will not attend regular College programs and to provide them, using volunteers, with the help they want, at their own pace, and in environments of their own choosing.

To do this effectively, the College must have the active support of ethnic societies, churches, community groups and social agencies. These organizations are able to identify potential students and can also provide a pool from which volunteers - bilingual or otherwise - can be recruited. If feasible, they might also provide space where instruction can take place. The College, in return, will assign community teachers to train the volunteers and to give on-going, back-up resource services and materials to them, as appropriate.

It must be emphasized that relationships between the College and the community are to be flexible, tailored to the needs of each group with whom we are working, as well as to the needs of the students. It is crucial that we be seen as a resource.

To make this happen, the E.L.T. Department will require a Head Teacher from August 15th 1979 (or earlier, if appropriate) to March 31, 1980 and perhaps somewhat longer, if the funding is continued.

Responsibilities Will Include:

- Contact and liaison with ethnic societies and other appropriate groups;
- Recruitment and supervision of community teachers;
- Recruitment and training of volunteers;
- Liaison with other E.L.T. programs and with social agencies, for the purpose of student referral;
- Maintenance of appropriate records, timelines, etc.;
- Publicity for the program;
- An evaluative report for the Ministry.

Desirable Qualifications:

- E.S.L. training and teaching experience;
- Experience in organizing groups and in community work;
- Ability to work effectively in an unstructured situation.

Interested instructors are asked to apply, in writing, by AUGUST 10th to R.F. Cunningham (in R. Meyer's absence).
