4) LEARNING CENTRE SERVICE

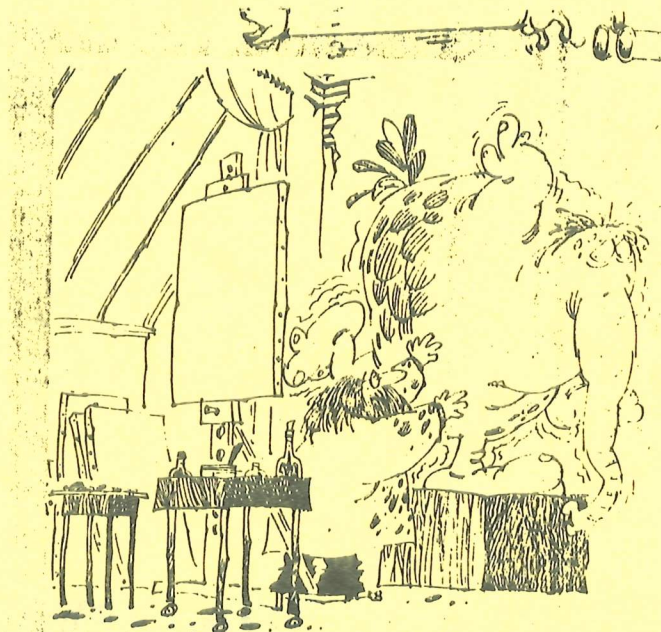
