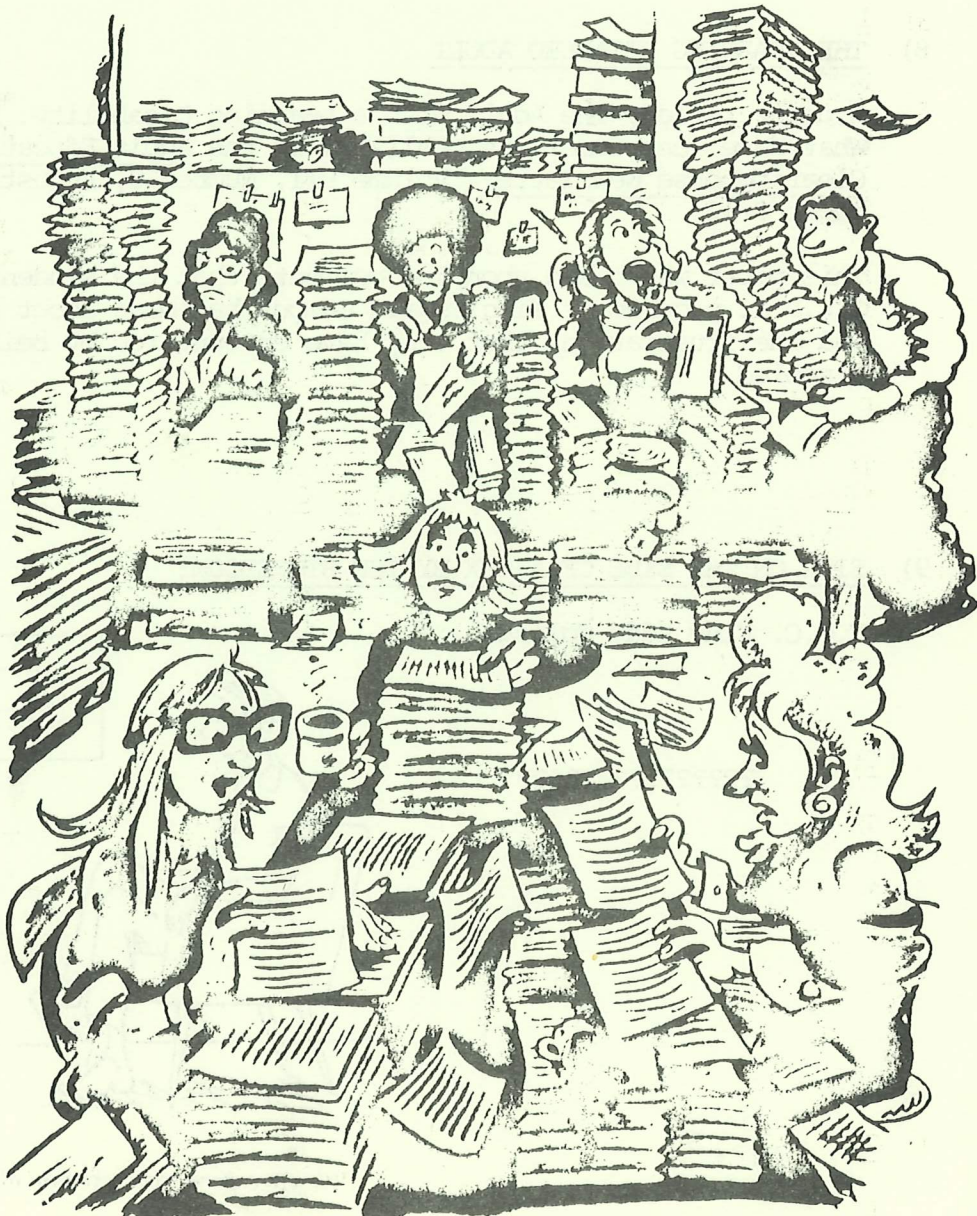


6) CHARGE-BACK SYSTEM - PRINTING AND DUPLICATING

Because of the ever-increasing costs of paper and the doubling of consumption of paper, it has become necessary to institute a charge-back system for printing and duplicating work. In the past, only major projects (such as a campus-produced workbook or curriculum) have been charged to individual departments. However, beginning in the current fiscal year, all work orders have been costed and charged back to the departments concerned. This is for supplies only; labor costs are not included.

Faculty and staff are urged to request only the copies actually required and that, wherever possible, work be done back-to-back.

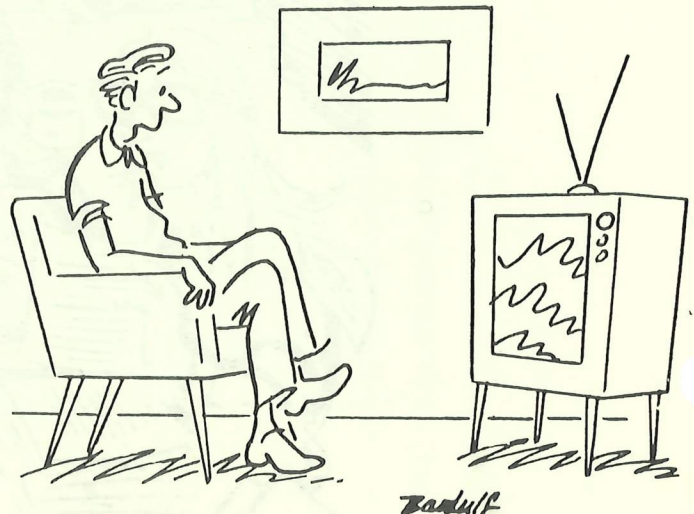
This paper was based upon the comments that the students in the I.E.P.A. program at King Edward Campus had made about their life and the frustrations that they have encountered by being learning disabled.
