## 1) VANCOUVER COMMUNITY COLLEGE BOARD MEETING

The College Board met in regular session on Wednesday, November 14th, at the Langara Campus.

The College Principal's report to the Board covered some 20 plus items, several of which touched on K.E.C. and its programs, including the re-organization of English Language Training, the workshops and concerts of the L.A. 4, the "action plans" arising from the Institutional Evaluation Report of last spring, and the Home Front Learning project.

Under new business, the following items may be of interest to readers of the Times:

1. A Facilities Planning Coordinator, for the building projects anticipated for all three campuses, will be appointed.
2. The Board, after reconsideration of the proposed name change for the V.V.I., defeated two motions:  
a) to drop the issue, and b) to re-introduce the matter at the next meeting of the Board.  
Thus, no action respecting the proposed name change was taken at Wednesday's meeting.
3. The Board received two reports on additional K.E.C. classes necessitated by the arrival of Vietnamese refugees.

Background documentation on the above and other agenda items, the College Principal's Report, and the minutes of the Board meeting of October 29th have been placed in the Library for the perusal of those interested.

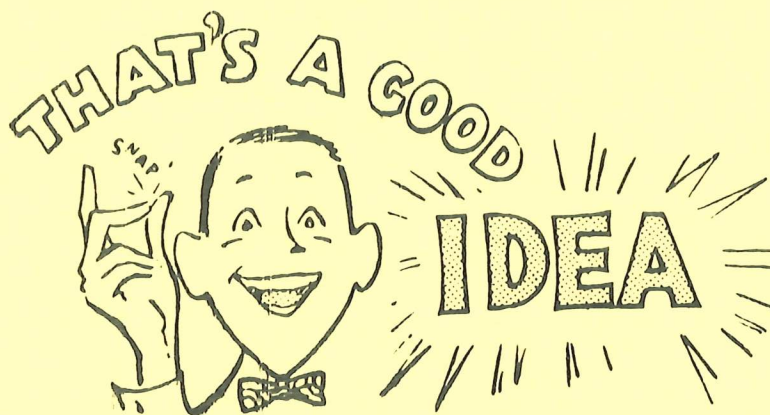
3) KING EDWARD DAY - 1980

5) STUDENT LEADERSHIP MINI-WORKSHOP

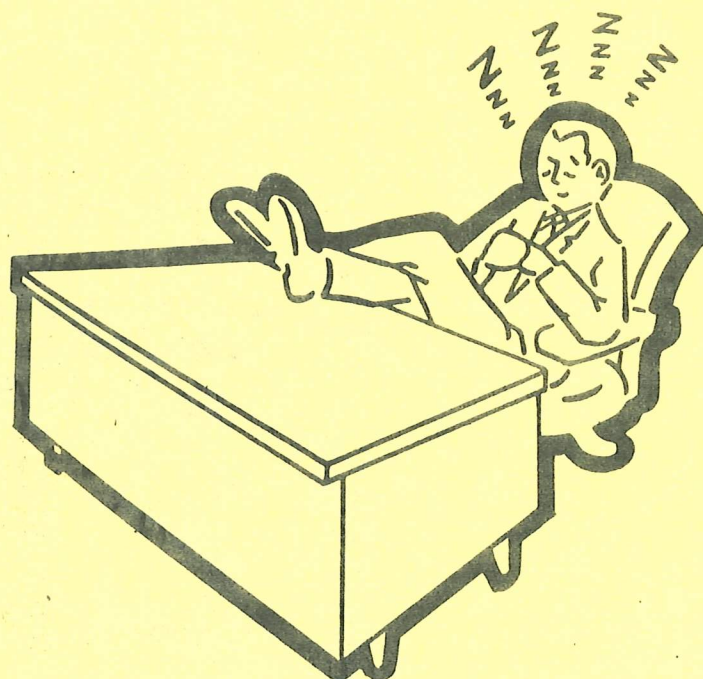

Apply in writing by November 26, 1979.

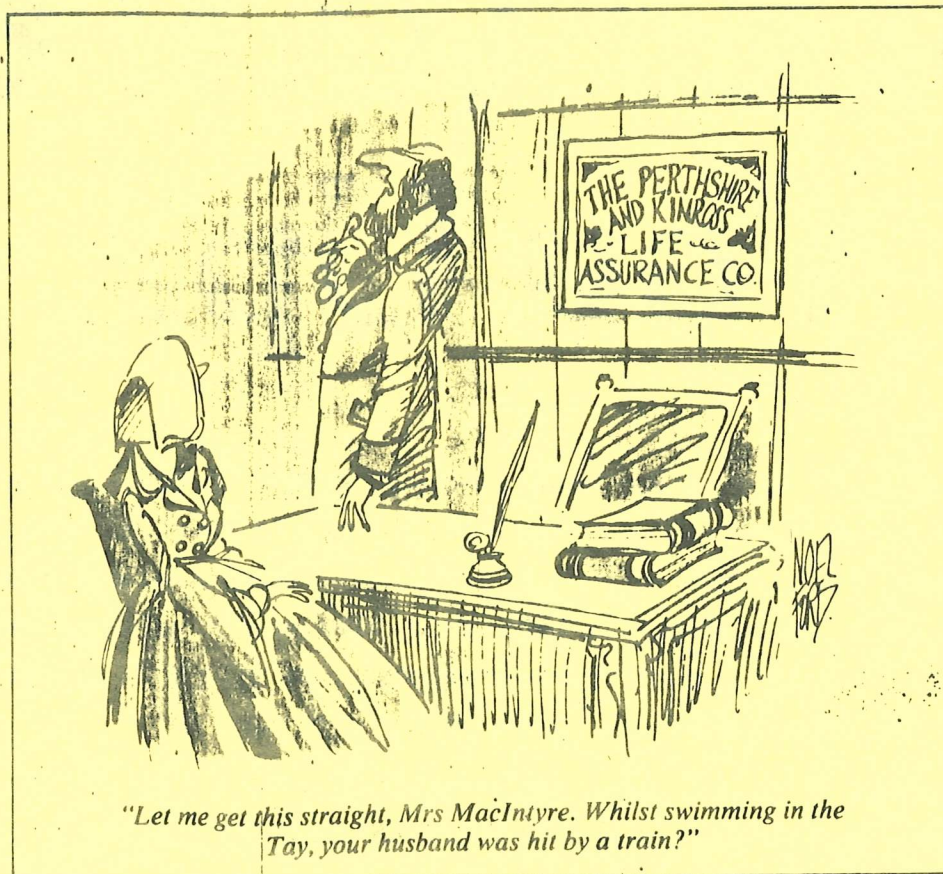
