## 1) CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR'S DAY - 1979/80

1. The V.C.C./V.I.A. Collective Agreement stipulates a Christmas holiday from December 24 to New Year's Day, inclusive. December 24th, this year, falls on a Monday.
2. Where possible, both the day classes and the afternoon/evening classes will report at 8:30 a.m. on the last day of instruction, that is, Friday, December 21st.
3. C.E.I.C. (Manpower) cheques will be issued in the morning and/or early afternoon on Friday, December 21st, to C.E.I.C.-sponsored students.
4. King Edward Campus re-opens in the new year on Wednesday, January 2nd, for counselling - registration - instruction.
5. During the period December 24th to January 1st, the administrative offices, library and information centre will be open from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., except for the statutory (general) holidays occurring during that period, on which days the Campus will be closed.

2) ABE COURSES

(Education 565) Seminar: "ABE Instruction" will be coordinated by P. Cookson at the Adult Education Research Centre, Fridays, from 1 to 4 p.m. Topics and seminar leaders will be announced by the December 7 meeting of the ABE Consortium.

It is probable that the Math Education Department will conduct a course "Teaching Math to Adults."
