




Vancouver Community College Board met in regular session on Wednesday, December 12th.


The Board announced that R. Howard has been appointed architect for the new facility to replace the existing King Edward Campus. In addition, the Board has, through public advertising, invited architects to submit credentials for the new construction and renovations at the V.V.I. as well as for the construction and renovations at the Langara Campus.

College Principal A. S. Manera introduced the five-year budget forecast which had been prepared at the Ministry's request. The Board referred the budget forecast back to the administration, requesting that the increments which were shown on a separate line be "folded in" to the various cost centres.

The College Board approved a policy on purchasing procedures. The matter was before the Board several weeks ago, but had been referred back to the administration for revision.

Minutes of the Board meeting of November 28th, the College Principal's report and material related to the agenda items have been placed in the library for the perusal of those interested.



LIBRARY PERIODICALS

Increasing numbers of staff are asking to have library magazines and periodicals routed to them. Whilst we welcome this increased use of library resources, it does create some problems (particularly with the weeklies) when a request is received for urgent information on a current topic. As many as thirteen names on the circulation list, coupled with delays during routing make it extremely difficult for library staff to know quickly where to lay hands on a particular title. Accordingly, and for a trial period, the current copy of each title will be retained in the library, and circulated only when the next issue arrives. This should give everyone equal access to current copies.

We now take over 300 periodical titles, so if you have not visited the library recently, why not drop in and see if there is anything of specific interest to you? If you would like to have your name added to a circulation list, or if you have any suggestions for additional titles, please let us know. This applies particularly to K.E.C. staff who work away from the Main Campus, and who may find it difficult to drop in on a regular basis.

Re: Vancouver Community College King Edward Campus Proposed China Creek Site
