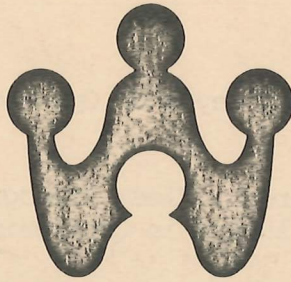

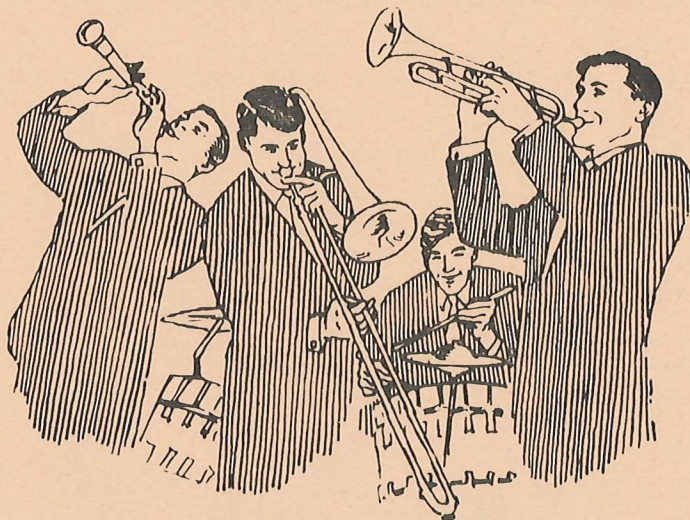


FROM THE MUSIC DEPARTMENT

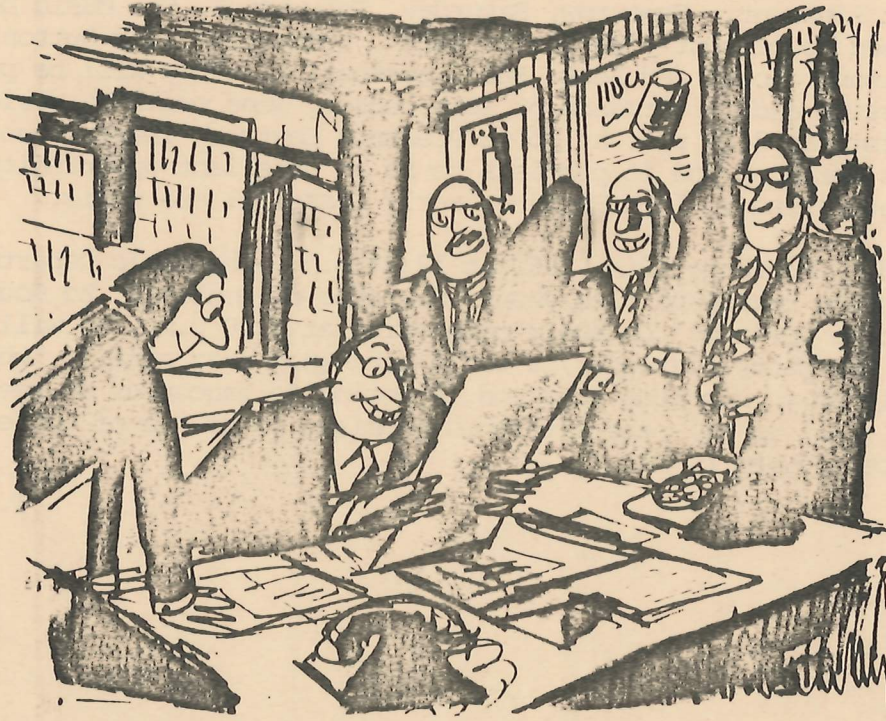

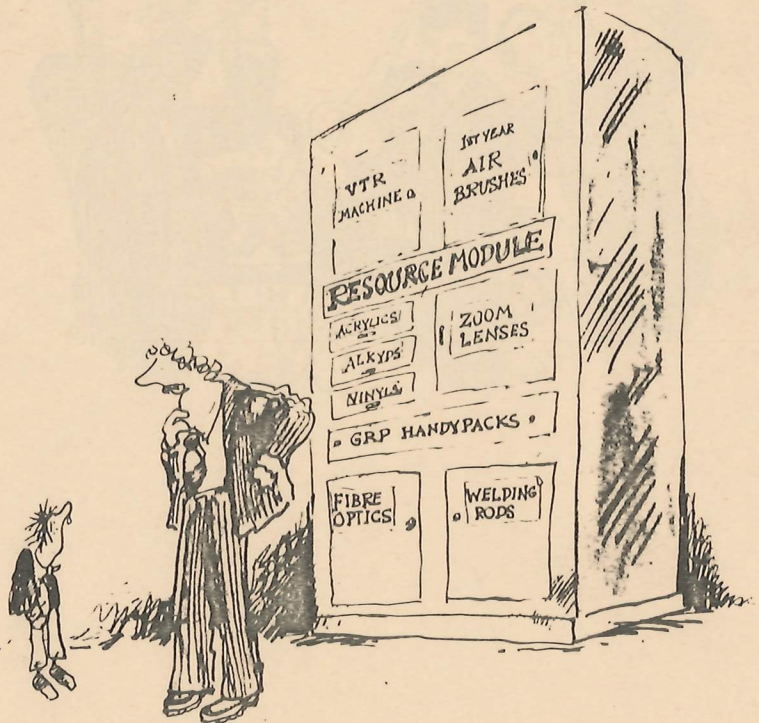
