COLLEGE BOARD MEETING

The new College Board met for its first regular business session on Wednesday, February 27th. A copy of the agenda, supporting documents, College Principal's report, and the minutes of the Board meetings of January 30th and February 13th have been placed in the library for the perusal of those interested.

The College Principal's report touched on a large number of items of college-wide and specific campus interest; several of which touched on K.E.C.-related matters: A.B.E. for construction workers; curriculum for A.B.E., grades 0 to 8; King Edward Day.

Mr. Manera presented a fairly complete report on the performance of V.C.C. students who have transferred to U.B.C.

The College Principal reported on the status of the College's building projects for K.E.C., Langara and V.V.I. The Board approved a resolution which added 39,825 net square feet for the heavy trades programs presently housed at V.V.I., thus increasing the proposed facilities at China Creek to 191,620 nsf.

The Board approved new rates for V.C.C. employees' use of their cars for local travel required by the College. New rates are based on kilometres rather than miles.

As indicated earlier, background documentation on the above and other items on the agenda have been placed in the library.
