LIBRARY NEWS

Saturday, March 1, 1980 saw the official opening of the newly located outreach project of "Learning Centre in a Library" at the Britannia complex, 1661 Napier Street.

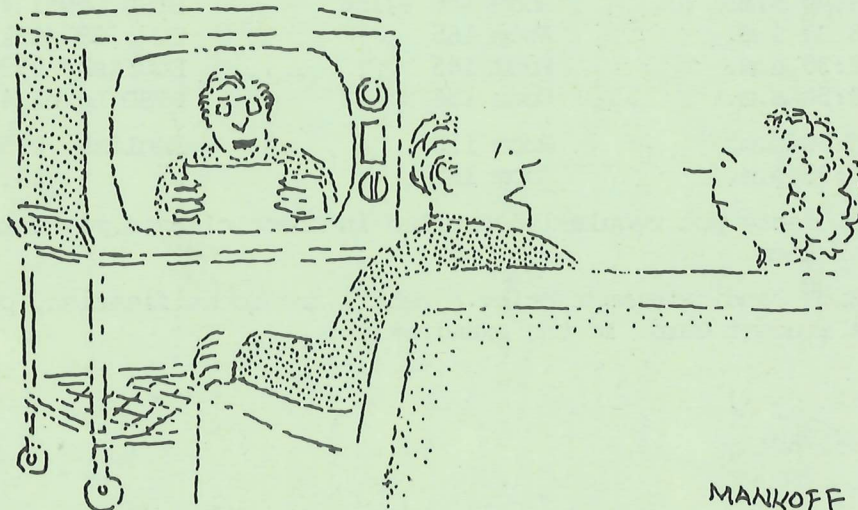
As many of you are already aware, VCC King Edward Campus has, for some time, been operating a Drop-in Centre for students at the Britannia Library. The new ground floor location makes it much easier for the casual visitor to see the full scope of the operation, particularly the dual roles of Instruction and Resources.

KEC Library support staff have been working on an automated catalogue based on the collection of materials at Britannia, and the Fiche catalogue is now available for use in its preliminary form at all KEC Library locations. Containing many hitherto uncatalogued materials, this Brief List catalogue should be of particular interest to all faculty and staff working in the ABE and ESL fields, especially since it lists items held in Public Library and School Library stocks, as well as our own KEC Library.

Multiple copies of most titles are available, and the list also tabulates materials held at the Mt. Pleasant and South Hill Public Library Learning Centre collections, together with a select list of items at VCC Mt. Pleasant Centre Library and KEC Main Library. The catalogue also lists all material in the TEAL Mel Henderson Memorial Collection Library.

It is hoped to run a "clean" version of the list in early April, and, thereafter, to update at regular intervals with re-runs. At least one copy of most items in the collection are available for inter-campus or inter-library loan. If you want more information, drop into any of the Libraries named above.

Selkirk College (Castlegar Campus) invites applications for the position of Admissions and Records Coordinator (Registrar). Applications will be received until March 28.

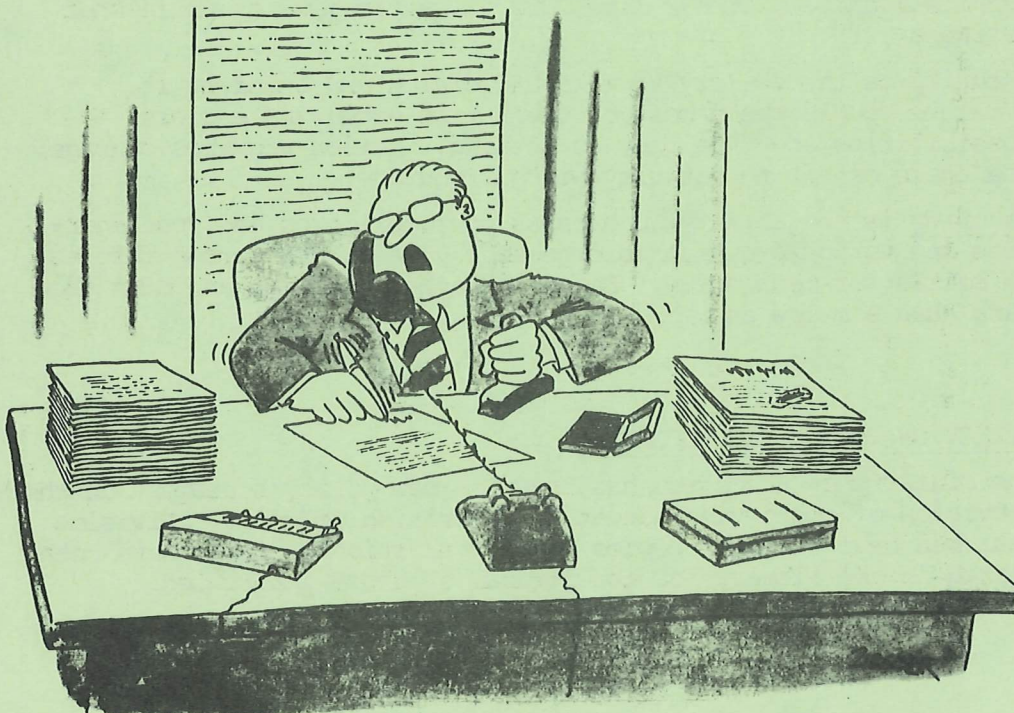

MATURITY IS.....

Maturity is many things. First it is the ability to base a judgement on the big picture, the long haul.

It means being able to pass up 'fun-for-the-minute and select the course of action which will pay off later. One of the characteristics of infancy is the "I want it NOW" approach. Grown-up people can wait.

Maturity is the ability to stick with a project or situation until it has been completed. The adult who is constantly changing jobs, changing friends, and changing spouses is immature. He cannot stick it out because he has not grown up. Everything seems to turn sour (or uninteresting) after awhile.

Maturity is the capacity to face unpleasantness, frustration, discomfort, and defeat without complaint or collapse. The mature person knows he can't have everything his own way. Life won't allow it. He is able to defer to circumstances, to other people, and to time.

Maturity is the ability to live up to your responsibilities and keep your word. This means being dependable. Dependability equates with personal integrity. Do you mean what you say and say what you mean?

The world is filled with people who can't be counted on. They never seem to come through in the crunch. They are cop-outs who break promises and substitute alibis for performance. Invariably they show up late - or not at all. They are confused and disorganized. Their lives are a chaotic maze of unfinished business.

Maturity is the ability to make a decision and stand by it. Immature people spend most of their time exploring endless possibilities and then they do nothing. Action requires courage. And there can be no maturity without courage.

Maturity is the ability to harness your abilities and your energies and to do more than is expected. The mature person refuses to settle for mediocrity. He would rather aim high and miss the mark than aim low and make it.
