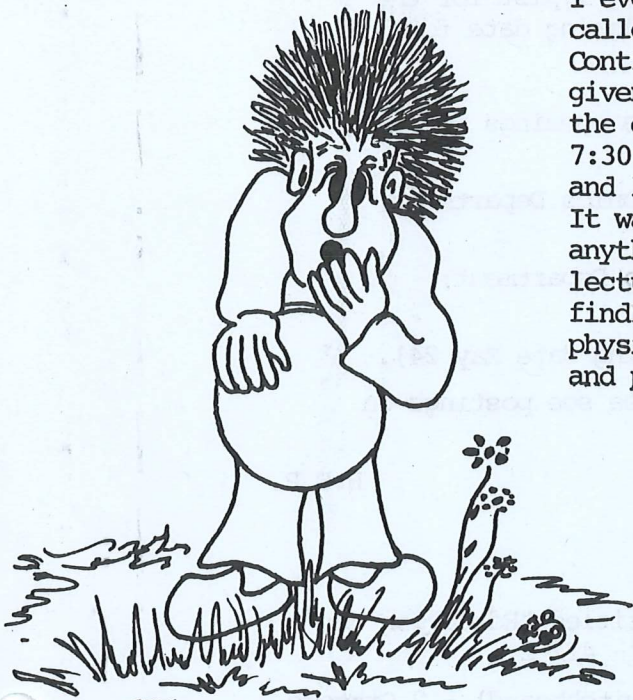

YOUR P.D. IS SHOWING!



**OOPS! YOUR P.D. IS SHOWING**

The most enjoyable and instructive P.D. time I ever spent occurred last May. The course was called "New Ways of Being," was sponsored by the Continuing Education Centre at U.B.C., and was given by Dr. Jean Houston and associates. With the exception of the first evening (Thursday - 7:30 to 11 p.m.), each day started at 7:00 a.m. and lasted until midnight - for five days!! It was the most intensive course I ever took in anything, and the most unusual. It consisted of lectures, historical reviews, research report findings in the area of brain/mind research, physical exercises which included dance movements and psycho-physical activities based on the Feldenbrais Method, relaxation exercises, visual imagery, guided fantasies and a host of other unconventional techniques for enhancing memory retention, left brain/right brain integration, body/mind integration, accelerated mental processes and much, much more. It was hard, unremitting, intensive work, sometimes wildly funny and sometimes awe-inspiring. Jean Houston is a Ph.D. in Psychology, Literature and Archeology and, with her husband Robert Masters, has founded the Institute for Mind Research in New York. In spite of the gruelling schedule, I emerged after five days immensely invigorated and enriched.

Although the course was not a strictly academic one, the things I learned and experienced have been of more help in my professional as well as my personal life, than all the conventional education courses I have taken put together.
