Our list of services includes birth control, V.D. tests and treatment, emotional health counselling, advice and treatment of medical concerns, first aid, referral to city resources, Pap smears, pregnancy tests, nutrition counselling, eye tests, blood pressure checks, relaxation information, dental referrals, etc., etc.

On July 16 from 11:00 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. and on July 17 from 2:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. in the corridor adjacent to the cafeteria. We (Dr. Rothon and myself) will be taking the blood pressures of any students or staff interested. The objectives of this project are three-fold: To allow the student body and staff to become familiar with health services, to inform students about what is high blood pressure and how it can be prevented, and to identify cases of hypertension and recommend follow-up.

We hope you will assist us in our objectives by encouraging your students to stop by and have their BP taken, or by bringing your class over to see us.

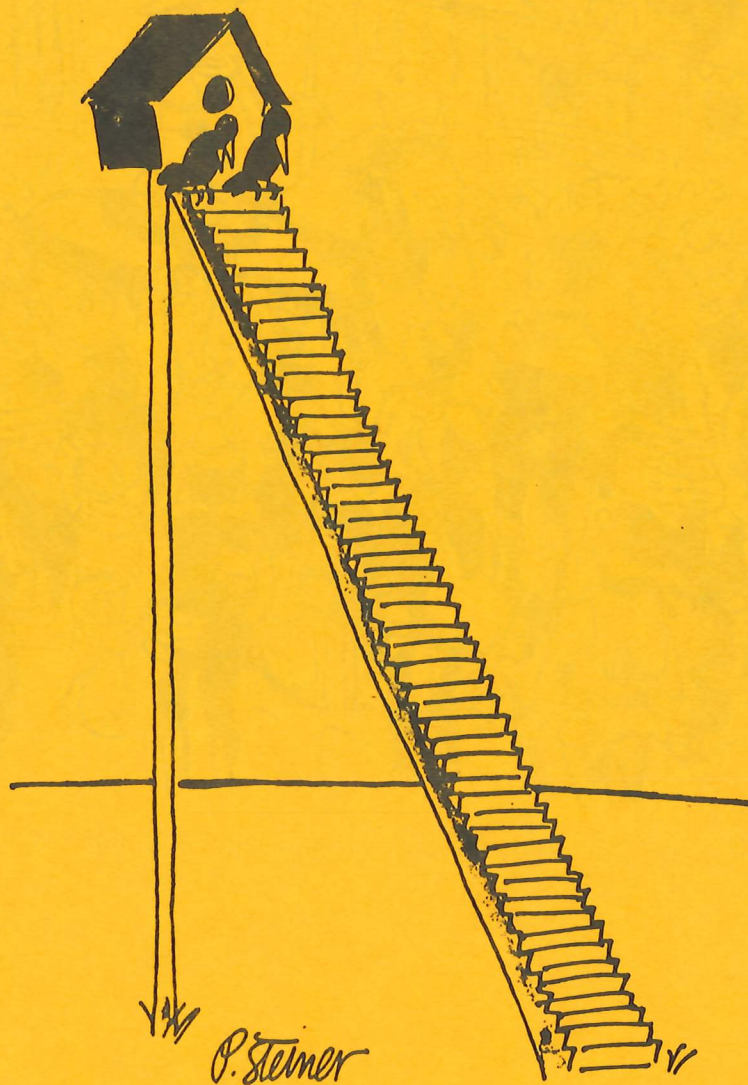
