VANCOUVER COMMUNITY COLLEGE BOARD MEETING

The College Board met in regular session on Wednesday evening, September 10th. Because the Board had not met since July 16th, the Board had to deal with a fairly lengthy agenda, several items of which will be touched on here.

The College Principal's report - a copy of which has been placed in the library - covered a large number of items, a number of which covered activities/events related to K.E.C. An information item in the report dealt with a comparison of V.C.C.'s productivity (in student contact hours) and operating budget as compared with comparable figures for the total college/institute system of B.C. as well as comparable figures for two fairly large post-secondary institutions in the lower mainland.

The architects for the construction project at the V.V.I. presented their revised plans and V.V.I. Principal J.L. McInnis has provided us with a copy of the current plans which have been placed in the library for the perusal of those interested.

A proposal to increase tuition fees - to cover the shortfall in government funding and the increased costs resulting from the rate of inflation was debated at length; the following motion was approved by the Board:

\* That V.C.C. Board By-Law Number 19 be amended as of 1981 January 01 by increasing fees for Academic/Technical programs from \$125.00 per term to \$150.00 per term and for Vocational programs from \$30.00 per month for full-time students to \$36.00 per month. Part-time students will pay fees on the same basis as at the moment (pro-rata or annually set Continuing Education fees as appropriate).

- The Board approved a motion authorizing additional borrowing by the College for pre-construction at the K.E.C. East Broadway facility for \$827,000.

The Board approved a request for submission to the Ministry for special funds for three additional learning centres at V.P.L. branches in the amount of \$63,750 (gross).

The Board approved a suggestion from the V.V.I. Student Society to study the pros and cons for a College "emblem and motto".

Documentation related to the above items and other items not covered in this report plus the minutes of the meeting of the previous Board meeting (of July 16th) have been placed in the library.

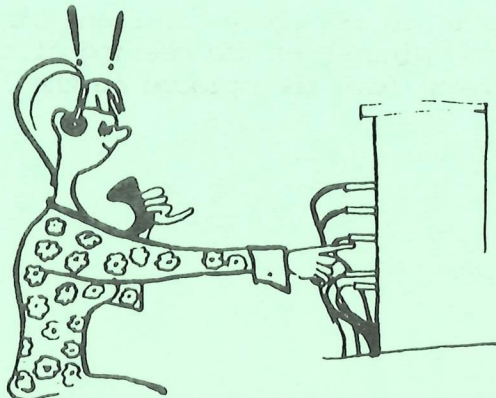

### MONEY TALKS!

B.T.S.D. level 4 students and those taking at least three courses at the grade 11 or 12 level in College Foundations may be eligible to apply for B.C. Student Assistance (student loans). Students in both these programs must be at least 18 years old. E.L.T. students are not eligible, although those in the full-time 059, 098-099 programs are. Music students are eligible.

Any students interested in applying should obtain an application from the Counselling Resource Centre, complete it (there is a completed sample in the centre) and return the form to me. This should be done immediately, as the Financial Aid Office will be closed from September 29 to October 24, while the Financial Aid Officer (Rita Shelley) is on holiday.

LIBRARY LUNCH TIME FILM SHOW

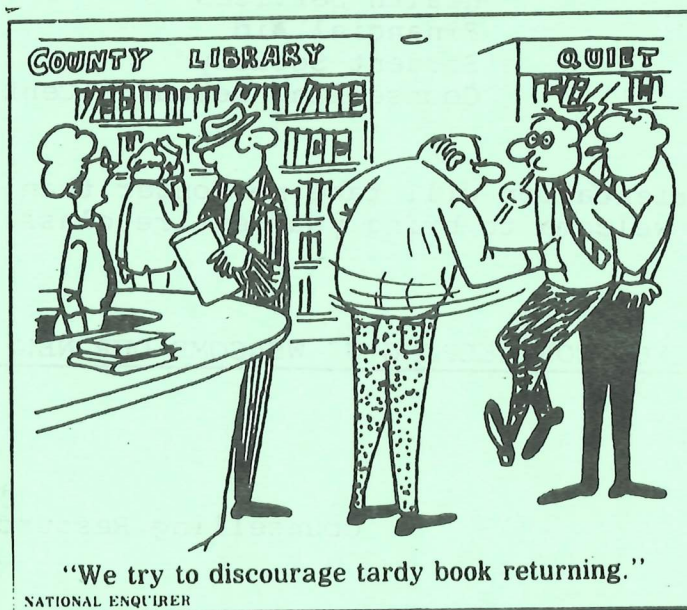
The next program will take place on Tuesday, September 16, 1980 at 12:30 p.m.
