Dr. Rothon will be in on Tuesdays and Thursdays all day and our psychologist, Margaret Kendrick, will be in on Wednesdays.

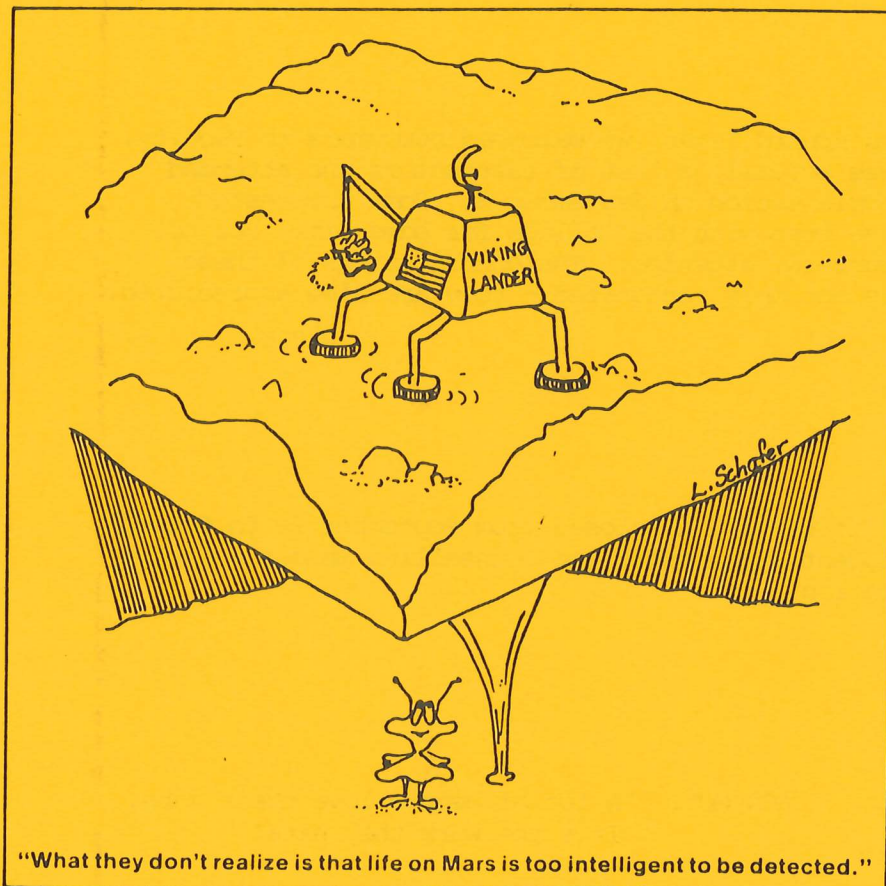
