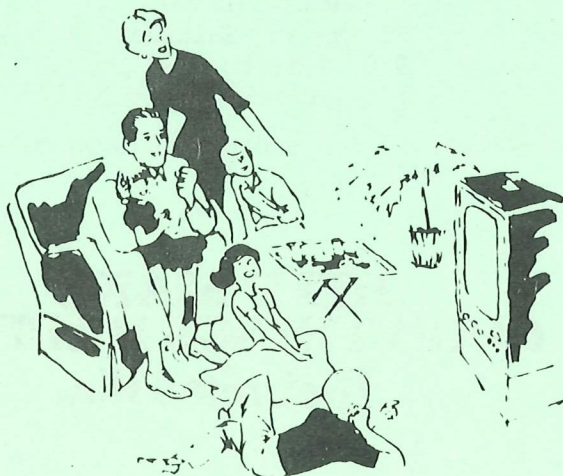
ON AIR!

On October 27th you will notice a Poster of Baby Pictures on the bulletin board by the coffee machine in the Main Office.

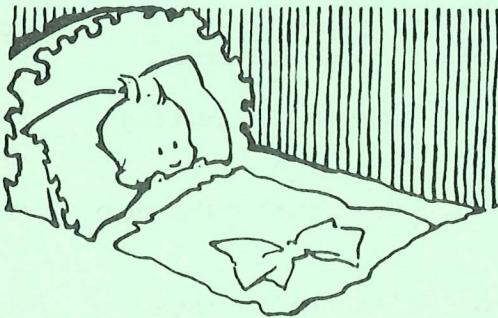
Who are these pictures of? you ask.

Katie, a little girl born with a hole in her heart. Her colds always turned to pneumonia, causing admission to hospital several times a year.

In 1979, Katie was set to undergo open-heart surgery ... but an hour before the operation she again developed pneumonia.
