NEIGHBOURHOOD ENGLISH DEPARTMENT

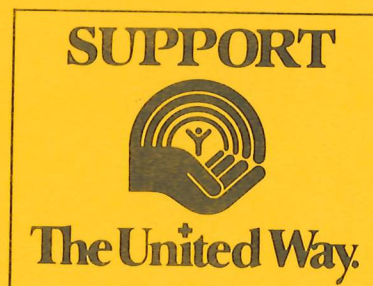
Mr. Pankratz, the Campus Principal, has graciously approved the name change from "Neighbourhood English Classes" to reflect appropriately the change of status of its operation.
