COLLEGE BOARD MEETING

The Vancouver Community College Board met in regular session on Wednesday, December 3rd.

As the first item of business, the Board heard a delegation from the students of the Practical Nursing Program at the V.V.I. who are requesting re-instatement of the \$150 bursary per month Proctical Nursing students received from the Ministry of Health until December 1979. The matter was referred to the administration for study and report.

The College Principal's report covered a number of items several of which are reported here:

- 1. The visit of the the Hon. Grace McCarthy, Minister of Human Resources and Deputy Premier, to the College. While at King Edward Campus, Mrs. McCarthy announced that she will include \$100,000 in her Ministry's 1980-81 budget which, subject to the approval of the Legislature, will be earmarked for a day care centre at our new campus.
- 2. The College, utilizing programs developed elsewhere, will be sponsoring programs to be offered via the Knowledge Network of the West (KNOW). Continuing Education is assuming responsibility for V.C.C. for this new venture.
- 3. Three requests for temporary funding for three courses (BEST-Hastings, BTSD 7 to 10 Hastings and BTSD 7 to 10 Musqueam) have been submitted to the Ministry.

At the Board meeting last month, Board members had expressed concern respecting the inflation rate that had been calculated for the facilities being planned for our new campus. The consultants were instructed to re-calculate which they did; their revised inflation figure was 4% lower.

Board meetings for the remainder of Board member's term of office are scheduled as follows:
