



PARKING CHARGES - KING EDWARD CAMPUS (reprint of letter received Dec. 15)

Pursuant to your correspondence of 80/11/24 and our recent telephone conversation, we have once again reviewed the matter of increased parking rates on the King Edward Campus.

Ever since the GVRD owned King Edward Campus property, the rates for parking have remained at the \$1.00 per day maximum. Since the rate at Vancouver General Hospital Parking Lot for visitors is to be increased to \$1.50 maximum daily, it is necessary that we parallel the same rate on the King Edward Campus. It should also be noted that the rate of \$1.50 per day is the lowest of any of four lots which the GVRHD operates. As of 81/01/01 the visitors' rate at the other lots will be raised to a maximum of \$2.00 daily with the charge for the first two hours: 75¢.

Rather than raise the rate for the first two hours from 50¢ to 75¢, we have chosen to allow three hours parking for the new rate of 75¢. As previously notified, the daily maximum is to be increased to \$1.50 daily.
