


GROUND BREAKING CEREMONY






SUBJECT: Year-end Benefits - Verification Notices


Under date of February 5, 1981, all Faculty and Staff were advised that, through the medium of a computer printout, vacation, sick leave and gratuity accumulations, utilization and balances were being verified.

Recognizing it is difficult for the individual to ascertain the accuracy of these figures, particularly the sick leave amounts, a change in the verification procedure is being made.

We would still request that any discrepancies be drawn to our attention where these may be identified by you. Prior to any figures, either disputed or undisputed, being confirmed and entered into the system as the official 1980 balances, they will be further reconciled with the ancilliary records of the campus or division. This should ensure that accurate reporting and record-keeping has taken place.

Some general difficulties inherent in the system have become evident, for example, for members of the Langara Faculty Association where vacation entitlements, according to the Collective Agreement, are expressed in terms of months and the system has been applying vacation credits in days. These general problem areas will be addressed and resolved immediately following completion of the verification/audit exercise.

Verification of the various credits for Administrators will be undertaken at a later date and Administrators will receive individual printouts at that time.
