COLLEGE BOARD MEETING

The regular meeting of the Vancouver Community College Board was held Wednesday evening, April 15th.

<u>President's Report:</u> College President A.S. Manera's report to the Board touched on the following four items which relate to King Edward Campus:

- Spring Festival of the Music Department,

- Certificate awarded to the Homemaker Program,

- Dislocation of K.E.C. classes resulting from the strike of civic employees, and

- Up-date on our new facilities on East Broadway.

A copy of Mr. Manera's report, in its entirety, has been placed in the library for the perusal of those interested.

<u>Enrolment Report</u>: Mr. Manera reported on College enrolment for the nine-month period ending December 1980. Among other facets of the report, the total number of student contact hours of instruction delivered for the period was 5,938,975, an increase of 370,042 over the comparable period of a year ago. King Edward's increase was 117,911.

Budgeting Process: A paper had been prepared, at the Board's request, on the budgeting process imposed on colleges and provincial institutes. The paper highlights the difficulties experienced by V.C.C. and suggests proposals for improvement of the system. The discussion paper was approved by the College Board for submission to the Minister. A copy of the paper has been placed in the library.

<u>Word Processing</u>: Authorization has been received from the Minister for the College to purchase word processing equipment and the Board approved the appropriate motions.

Educational Plan: For the past several months, the College's ad hoc Educational Plan Committee, under the chairmanship of C. R. Carter, has been drafting our educational plan for the 1980 to 1985 period and the final report has now been presented to the Board. Because some Board members desired additional time to read and study the section on College objectives, further discussion and action was tabled to the next meeting of the Board. A copy of the educational plan will be placed in our library after it is approved by the Board.

<u>Student Concerns</u>: A spokesman for the V.V.I. student body presented an oral brief to the Board which touched on a number of issues, including College programs/services, tuition fees, child care, student/Board relationships, etc.

A copy of the minutes of the Board meeting of March 25th, as well as documentation related to the above, and other items on the Board's agenda, have been placed in our library.


