COLLEGE BOARD MEETING

1. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

- a) 1981/82 operating budget for the College has a shortfall of \$1.5 million just to carry out the same programs as last year.
- b) The building permit application review for the new campus has proceeded to the point that only minor detailed items remain to be resolved.
- c) Four tenders have been submitted for the construction of the main building.
- d) Fourteen KEC students received awards at a Student Awards Luncheon.
- e) Special Training Initiatives

The Minister of Education has established a Special Training Initiative Fund for \$4 million, the primary intent being to get people quickly into employment. Sixteen proposals have been prepared, two from King Edward Campus - "Homemaker Program for Chinese Speaking Adults" and "Teacher Training for English as a Second Language".

- f) Communications are taking place with the Ministry of Education to provide sufficient funds for the 280 seats in English Language Training for C.E.I.C. referrals.
- g) Proposals have been submitted to the Ministry for a B.T.S.D. program to be given at the Urban Native Centre and another at the Britannia Community Centre.

2. BUSINESS ARISING FROM MINUTES

- a) The Education Plan, copies of which are to be found in the Library, was submitted to the Board. The Board approved the Plan for submission to the Ministry of Education.
- b) The Board approved the temporary borrowing for the construction of the New King Edward Campus to a total aggregate of \$22,800,000.

3. NEW BUSINESS

- a) The College Board did not recommend that a student be nominated to serve on search committees for the Deans' positions.
- b) The College Board approved the Policy & Procedures on Student Grievances.
- c) Temporary Funding Courses for:
 - Dental Assisting at the V.V.I.
 - Native Employment Skills Training by K.E.C. at the Vancouver Indian Centre.
- d) The next College Board Meeting will be on 1981 June 03 instead of 1981 May 27 to avoid conflict with the A.C.C.T. conferences.

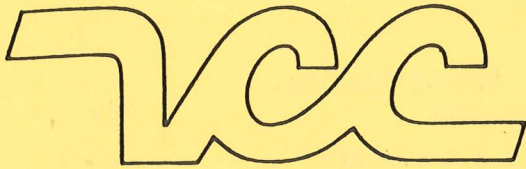
