## COLLEGE BOARD MEETING: 1981 JUNE 03

Highlights of the meeting included the following:

1. The Board approved the 1981/82 operating budget of \$40,203,889 and the 1981/82 operating capital budget of \$880,600. In addition, the allocation of \$40,000 by the Ministry Standing Committee for King Edward Campus was approved.

2. The draft agreement between the Parent Encouragement Group and the college to operate the day-care centre at the new King Edward Campus was approved.

3. The audited financial statement for the 1980/81 actual expenditures was approved.

Copies of the minutes, agenda and agenda material may be reviewed in the library.


To: King Edward Instructors

As you know, April 1st., 1981, Student Health Services came under the jurisdiction of the college. After some consideration we presented the idea of a student and staff questionnaire to the administration group who reacted favorably to the proposal. Instructions are as follows:

Having heard the answers she claims that she knows Xerxes' number and writes it down. But she is wrong, which is not surprising considering that only the second of Xerxes' answers is true.


Beatrice, who has heard none of this, then asks Xerxes two different questions:

Starting in September 1982, candidates will have to score at least 45 in ALL five tests in order to earn the Certificate.


Thus, under the new criteria, nine of the thirty-seven who earned their certificates in April would have to re-write at least one test: one would have had to re-write three!
