COLLEGE BOARD MEETING

The regular meeting of the Vancouver Community College was held on Wednesday, July 8th. The following items were dealt with by the Board:

1. The President's Report covered current items of interest to the College, including the designation of the Tone-Art Quartet as V.C.C.'s string quartet-in-residence; the resignation of Ron Fussell as division chairman after having served in that capacity for six years, and the appointment of Gordon Pawelchak as the new chairman; and the approval by the Ministry of ten special training initiatives, including a Homemaker training program.
2. Board member E. Jarvis prepared a report in November 1979 which dealt with education and student services. The College President presented a comprehensive up-date on the earlier report. A number of Board members expressed concern respecting the rather large number of students enrolling in the College at the post-secondary level, with the appropriate "paper" qualifications, who are not able to read or write at the appropriate level.
3. A progress report on the Langara Campus student building was presented by students from Langara.
4. International Education. After considerable discussion, Board approved a motion supporting the College's continued involvement in international education.
5. Canadian School of Takudai. The Board approved a contract with Takushoku University for a six-month English language program for 45 Japanese students being provided through Continuing Education.
6. Policy on Tuition and Other Fees. The Board approved a motion approving the policy and procedures on the setting of tuition and other fees.

In subsequent motions, the Board approved new tuition fees for Continuing Education and authorized the President to consult with the executives of faculty associations and student societies respecting tuition fee increases for credit courses.

7. During the Board's private session, the Board ratified the negotiated collective agreements with the V.M.R.E.U. and the V.I.A.

Minutes of the Board's previous meeting, background information on the items covered in this report as well as a number of other agenda items and the President's Report have been placed in the library for the information of those interested.

With regret, the Master station has now been removed, and the Audio Lab is back to the original state of individual units. It is possible to monitor only one station at a time.

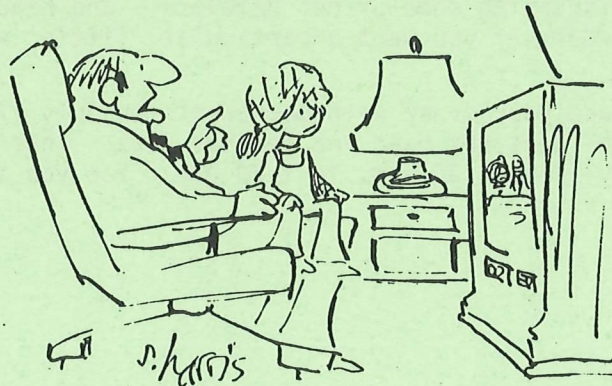
There are twenty-four units, and classes should continue to book time slots as usual. Individual students may use the facilities at any time during normal library hours.
