NEWS FROM COUNSELLING

Personal counselling accounts for a large percentage of our work. What kind of personal counselling? Here is an example: The student is one who has now left V.C.C. and the name is not her real one.

Judy came to K.E.C. with a social worker from the Maples, a residential school at the Burnaby Mental Health Centre. Judy was a runaway sixteen-year-old, deeply distressed and rebellious.

She entered College Foundations and had a difficult time integrating her particular personality into the structure here. She came for over two years for regular counselling, for support and encouragement, and the consistent help enabled her to wrestle her way through to her Grade 12. The instructors were unfailingly supportive and accommodating too.

Today Judy is working intensively with her native people. In her early 20's, she edits and produces material needed for the advancement of Indian people. She still contacts her counsellor periodically and says that, without the opportunity she had at K.E.C. to vent her angers and share her successes, she would not have been able to complete her Grade 12.

There are 100's of Judys that counsellors work with on a regular basis.
