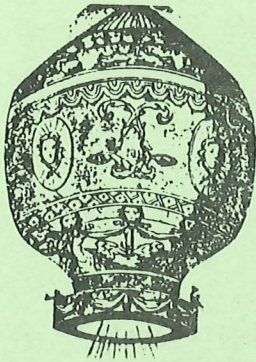

POLICY:

- A.1 A student who completes the requirements of a program which requires up to one year of full-time study (or the equivalent through part-time studies) is eligible to receive a Vancouver Community College Certificate.
- A.2 A student in the Music Department, who successfully completes the requirements of the music diploma program is eligible to receive the Vancouver Community College Fine Arts (Music) Diploma.
- A.3 A student who, having completed a prescribed one-year certificate program, completes one more year of full-time studies, or its equivalent part-time, is eligible to receive the Vancouver Community College Coordinated Studies Diploma.
- A.4 A student eligible for a College Foundations Certificate may obtain the certificate on request from the Student Records office.
- A.5 Normally all other eligible students receive their certificates at department/division ceremonies at, or near, the end of their respective programs.

PROCEDURES:

- B.1 Each student who anticipates receiving a Fine Arts (Music) Diploma must complete an application form at least one month before the awards ceremony. The form is available from the Music Department office.

- B.2 Each student who anticipates receiving a Coordinated Studies Diploma must complete an application form at least one month before the awards ceremony. The form is available from the Student Records office.
- B.3 Each student who anticipates receiving a College Foundations Certificate must complete an application form, no earlier than the term in which he becomes eligible to receive the certificate. The form is available from the Student Records office.
- B.4 On receipt of the completed diploma/certificate application form, Student Records will check to ensure that the requirements have been met.
- a) If they are complete, the Student Records office will prepare certificates/diplomas for the Principal's signature.
  - b) If they are not complete, the applicant will be so informed.
- B.5 For all other certificate programs, the department heads responsible will give all pertinent information to Student Records.
- a) The Student Records office will prepare certificates for the Principal's signature.
- B.6 If students being awarded diplomas/certificates are absent from their respective awards ceremonies, or if no ceremonies take place, the diplomas/certificates will be mailed by Student Records, or they may be picked up at the Student Records office, as requested.

V.C.C./V.V.I. requires a Department Head in the Electronics Dept. Closing date for applications if January 8, 1982.

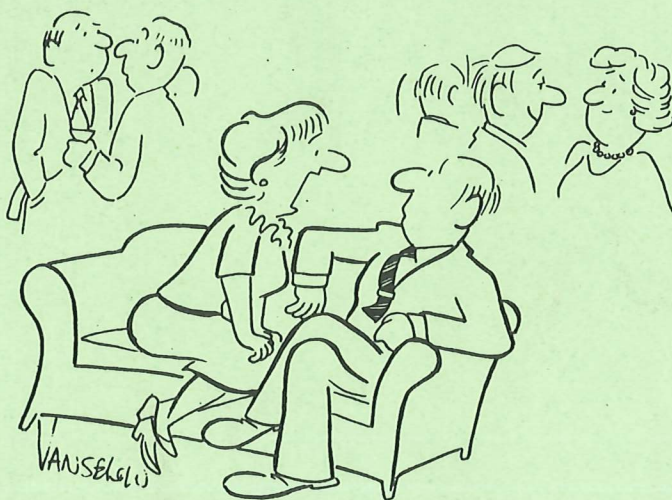
