
Although this course deals with the special needs of children, there may be some carry over into the problems of some adults who come to this campus.


NOSTALGIA....

HEALTH AND SAFETY

The K.E.C. Health and Safety Committee met on January 28, 1982. This committee is under the umbrella of the College-wide Occupational Health and Safety Committee. One of the concerns brought to the committee's attention involved lifting of heavy objects. The following excerpt is re-printed from Industrial Health Safety and Regulations:

Manual lifting and carrying restrictions

Materials, articles or objects required to be manually lifted, carried or moved shall be lifted, carried or moved in such a manner and with such precautions and safeguards, including training, protective clothing, and mechanical aids as will ensure that the process does not endanger the health and safety of any worker.





MAINTENANCE OF CLASSROOM LIGHTING

This subject was covered in the Times last October.

Generally, two men are needed to change flourescent fixture tubes. If the problem is a tube-change only, about ten minutes is needed to get the job done. If, in addition to the tube change, a new ballast coil is needed, the job could take 15 to 20 minutes.

Safety requirements stipulate that students may not be in the classroom when lighting maintenance work is being done. Therefore, maintenance staff will make the required changes when the classroom is not in use as, for example, during coffee breaks or when classes are changing, etc. (Because of the pressure of their regular work load, the night shift janitorial staff do not handle any lighting maintenance jobs.)

Instructors and students may be moderately inconvenienced by having to take a slightly longer coffee break or by having to delay the beginning of a class session while the maintenance work is being done. If you have a problem with your classroom lights, please alert Roger or Mike or Steve and arrange a "best time" for the work to be done.
