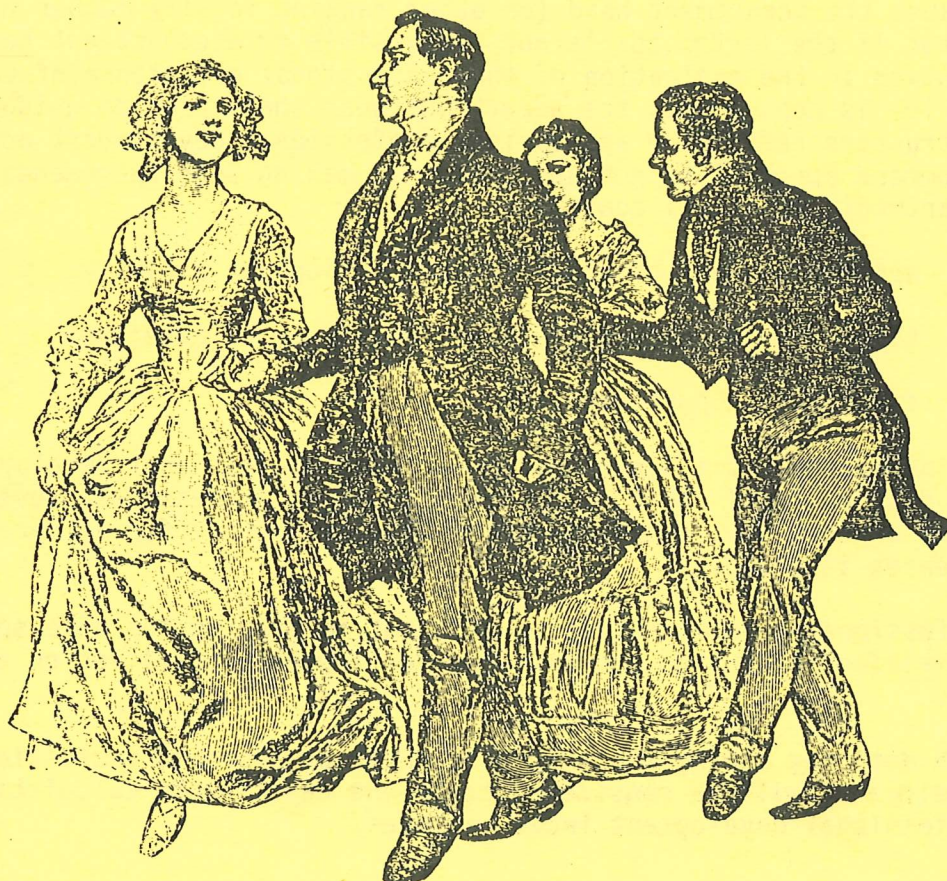

POLICY:

- A.1 The College supports the concept of leave for the purposes of professional development of faculty.
- A.2 A minimum number of "professional development days" has been agreed upon for all members of faculty; the number is reflected in the V.I.A. Collective Agreement.
- A.3 The College will appoint auxiliary instructors, where needed, to substitute for instructors on professional development leave.
- A.4 Because the department head (or other ranking faculty member or administrator if the instructor is not responsible to a department head) is involved in the evaluation of the professional competence of each instructor in his department, the department head shall provide guidance to instructors respecting appropriate professional development activities and recommend approval or non-approval. In making such recommendation, the department head shall consider:
- a) appropriateness of professional development activity;
 - b) timeliness of the professional development leave; and
 - c) financial support required.
- A.5 An instructor who is involved in approved professional development on a non-duty day will not be considered to be on professional development leave on that day, even though the College may pay for all or part of the expenses involved.
- A.6 Professional development leave will not be granted for time spent in travelling to or from professional development activities on a non-duty day.
- A.7 Each duty day during which time is spent on approved professional development will be considered to be one day for the calculation of professional development leave purposes.

PROCEDURES:

- B.1 The applicant for professional development leave completes the "Request for Leave from Duty" form, prepares a brief description of the purpose of the leave, its intended outcomes and benefits and submits both to his department head or other ranking faculty member or administrator.
- B.2 The department head, or other ranking faculty member or administrator, assesses the request and the proposed activity(ies), notes his recommendation thereon and submits both to the division chairman, if appropriate, for recommendation, with or without further comments; thence to the appropriate dean for approval or non-approval.
- B.3 The dean submits the original of the approved, or non-approved, application to the Director of Human Resources. Copies thereof are returned to the applicant as well as to each signatory thereof. An additional copy is retained in the applicant's ancillary file on campus.
- B.4 Within one month of the leave, the instructor shall prepare and submit to his department head (or ranking faculty member/administrator) an appropriate report of the professional development undertaken during the leave period.
- B.5 If funds were approved for the leave, the applicant is required to submit on a photocopy of the approved "Request for Leave from Duty" a statement of reconciliation for the use of those funds. This statement is to include all appropriate receipts of actual expenses incurred. The reconciliation is then submitted to the appropriate campus budget officer for approval and thence to the Accounting Department.

Note: This amendment eliminates two procedural items.

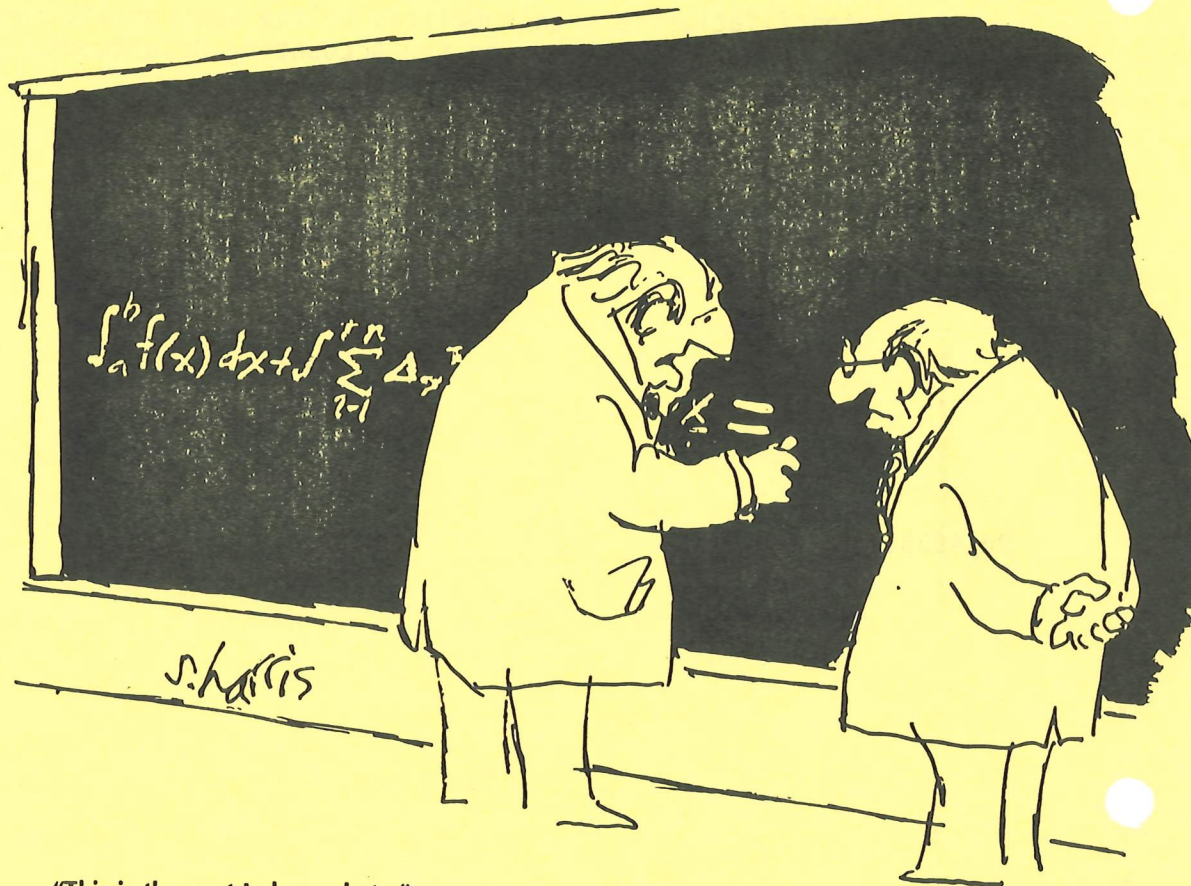

The hours were 8.30 to 3.15, with one hour off for lunch and two coffee breaks. Some of the classes were at the Special Programs Division, later known as K.E.C.

En route, I tripped over the feet of a Chinese student and crashed inelegantly across an empty seat. Now, of course, it was I, who though cold...no, frozenly sober, appeared to be the one sauced-up member of the class. The Chinese boy decided it was politic to be traditionally inscrutable.

Breathing hard, I arrived in front of the merry celebrant, and was about to play "the heavy" in regard to classroom regulations.... whatever they were.... when my friendly Frenchman raised his cup to me, wished me "Joyeux Noel" with another blast of alcoholic vapour, and drained the cup to the last drop. Then he grabbed my hand, kissed it ardently, and sat looking up at me with great, melting, innocent, loving, adoring, devoted, and completely unfocussed eyes.

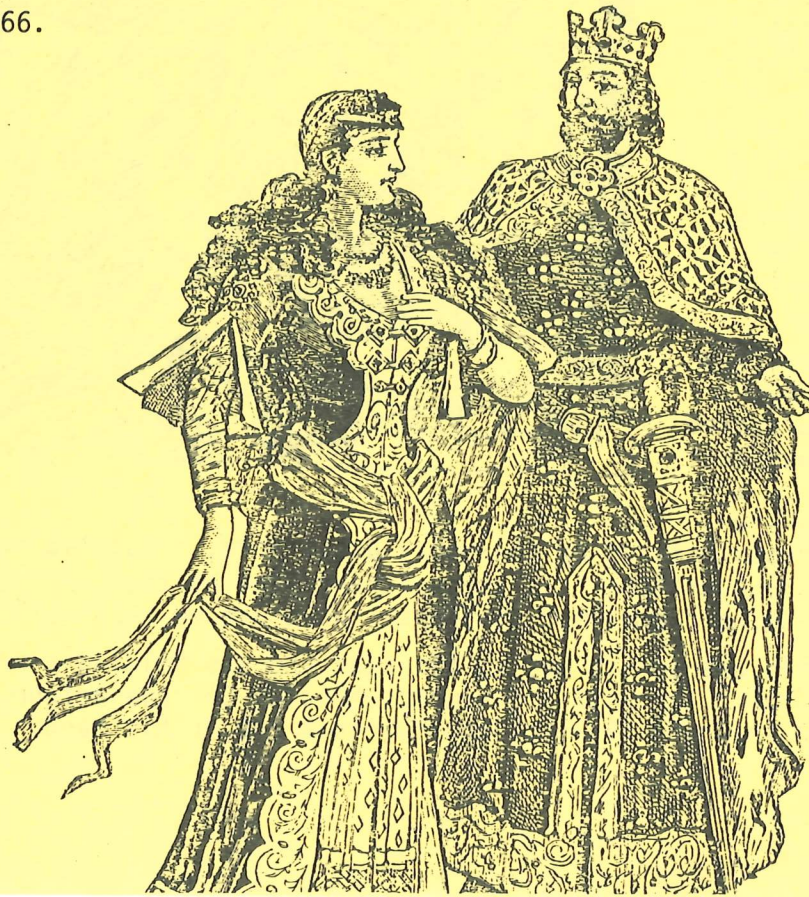
I tottered back to the front of the classroom and wished them all a good morning and a merry Christmas.

NOSTALGIA....."BREATHING HER LAST".....

Fortuitous circumstance left me in the summer of '73 with an activity much coveted by university students at the time - a job in the city. My grand job title of "electrician's helper at VGH obscured my true function: light bulb changer.

On the afternoon of June 19th, I returned to the electrician's shop to pick up my next batch of maintenance requisition forms directing me to yet new rooms, offices, highways, byways and tunnels where the fluorescent firmament had grown dim. Upon arrival, I was surprised to find the shop empty of its regular complement of tinkering electricians. As well, the door to 12th avenue was ajar. I walked out the door, looked to the right, and will not forget the scene to greet me that day.

King Edward was a wall of flame. All wings were being consumed at once. Firetrucks and firemen were everywhere and frantic in the desperate struggle, but their efforts did not seem to even tickle the conflagration. A crowd of hundreds, more likely thousands, had spilled out of the hospital, King Ed and surrounding buildings to witness the spectacle. I was almost two blocks from the flames but remember being hit with wave after wave of furnace-like blasts.

After a time it was obvious the fire would win. Seeing no necessity of observing the obvious conclusion, I returned to my duties. As the last bulbs of the day were attacked, I felt saddened at the loss of an old friend in my city. All that was left was ash and a memory.

I never knew what it was like to work in the old King Edward, but that day the great "mother of high schools" breathed her last, has stayed with me ever since.

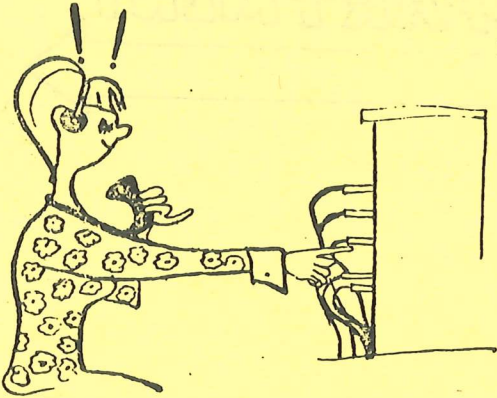

JOB BOARDS ... ON CAMPUS?

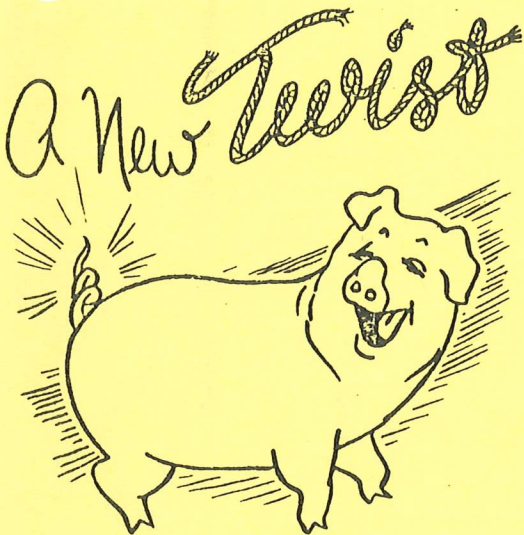

5 miles.)

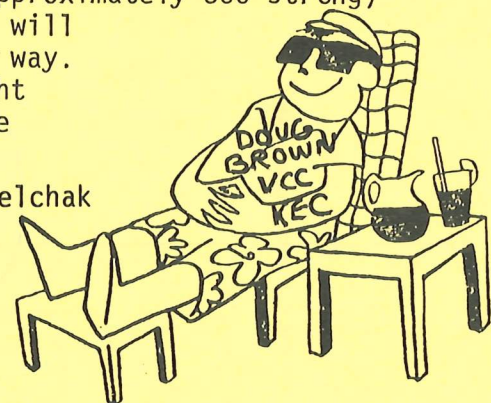
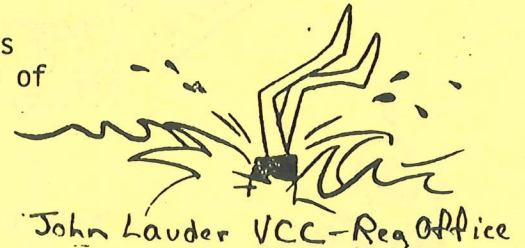
Starting Point: We have been invited to use the

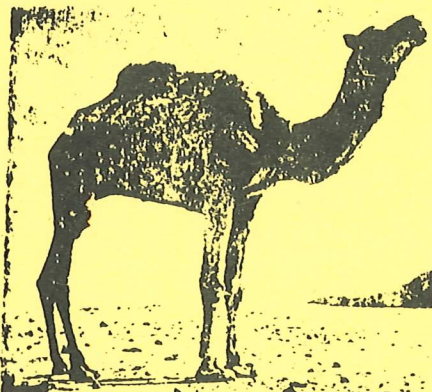
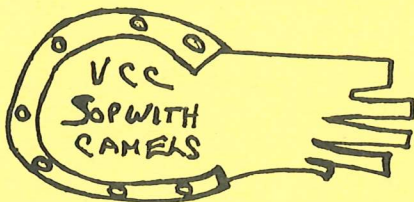
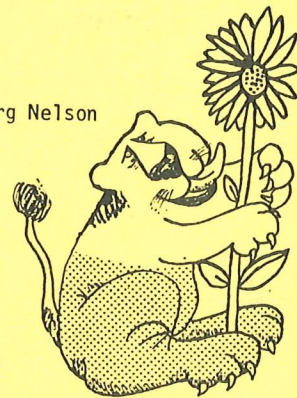
