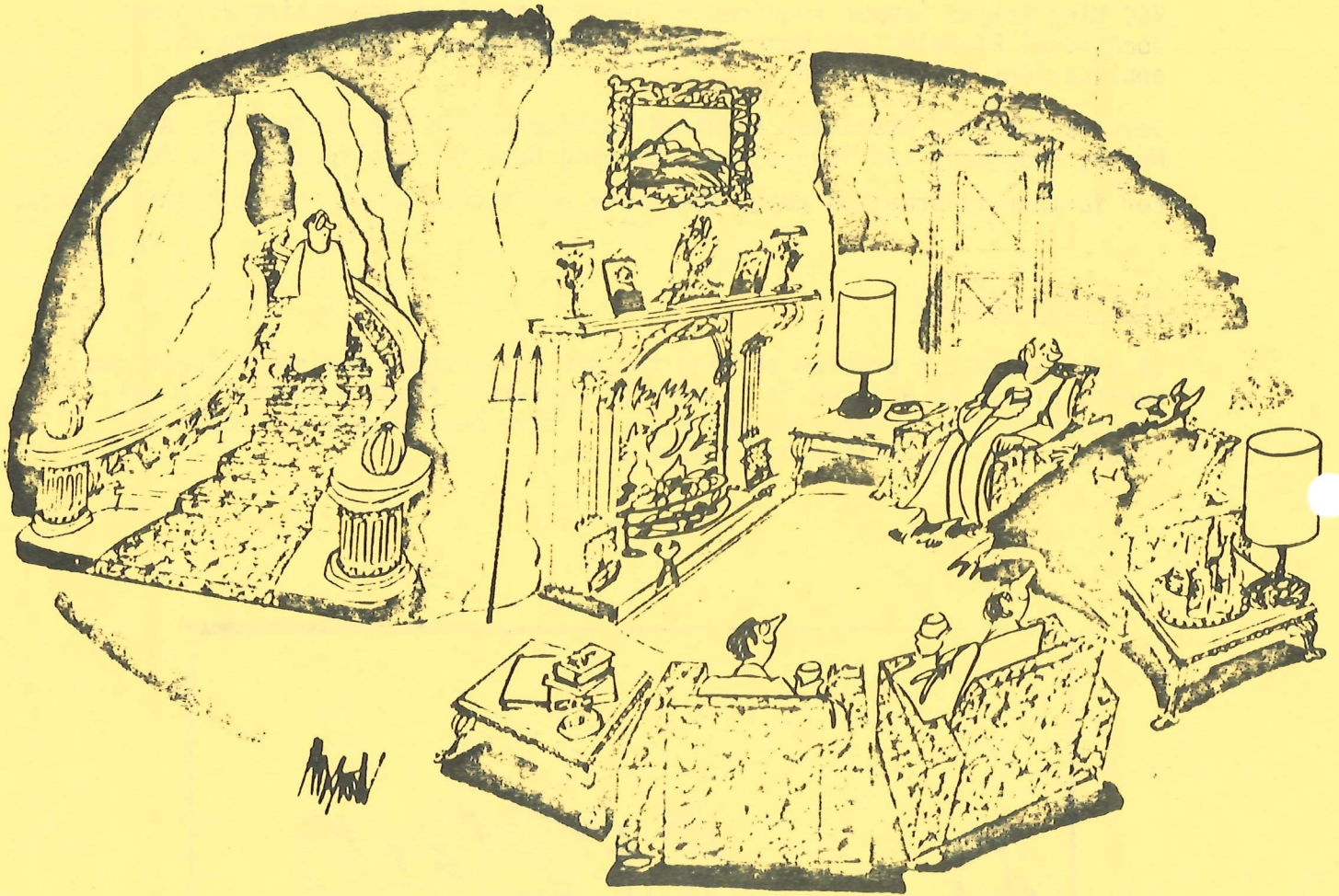
TELEPHONE SERVICE
