### COLLEGE BOARD MEETING

The Vancouver Community College Board met in public session Wednesday evening, June 2nd.

The major decision made by the Board was to increase tuition fees by approximately 15%, effective 1982 September 01. For King Edward Campus, the new tuition fees will be as follows:

For full-time students: \$40.00 per course per term to a maximum of \$200.00 per term; or,  
\$48.00 per month.

For part-time students \$ .70 per student contact hour.

Other significant decisions made:

- a) Approval of the Summer English Language Program for Japanese children at U.B.C.'s Totem Park for a contract price amounting to \$230,621.
- b) Approval of a T.F.C. (Temporary Funded Course) for English Language Training for 340 students for a total of \$1,529,814. (These are not additional seats; the students are already at Strathcona.)

The next Board meeting is scheduled for June 23rd.

Minutes of the Board meeting of 1982 May 12 and documentation related to Wednesday's agenda have been placed in the library for the perusal of those interested.
