AUDIO-VISUAL SUPPORT - FRIDAY EVENINGS

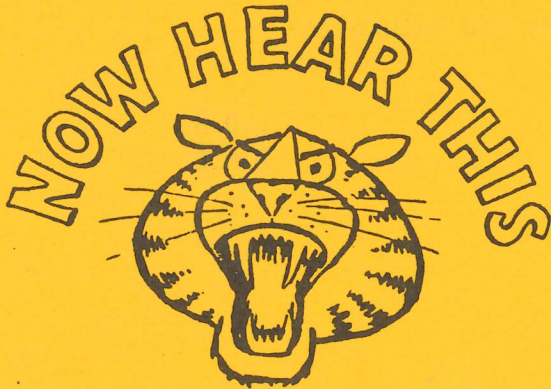
Staff of the Audio-Visual Department are not on duty on Fridays after 17:00 hours.

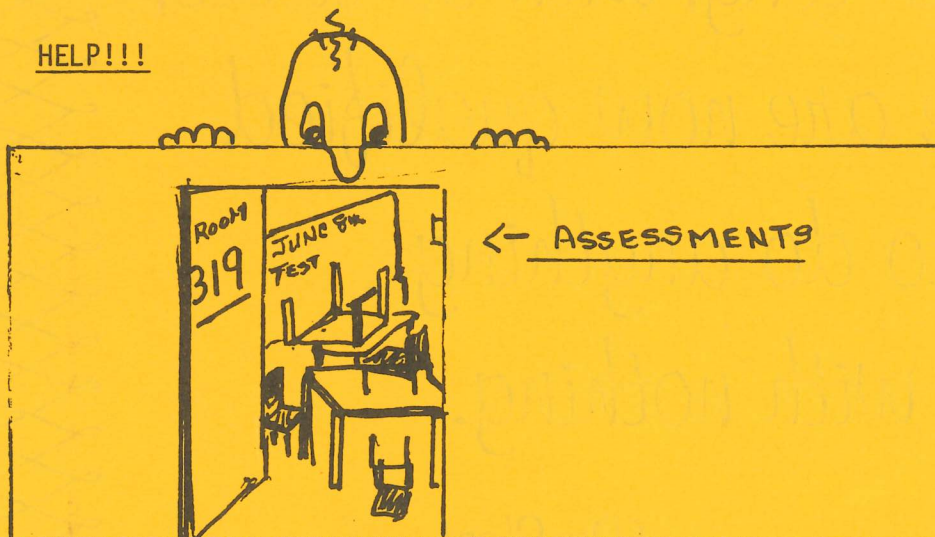

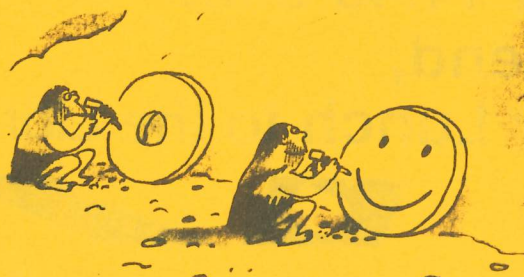
