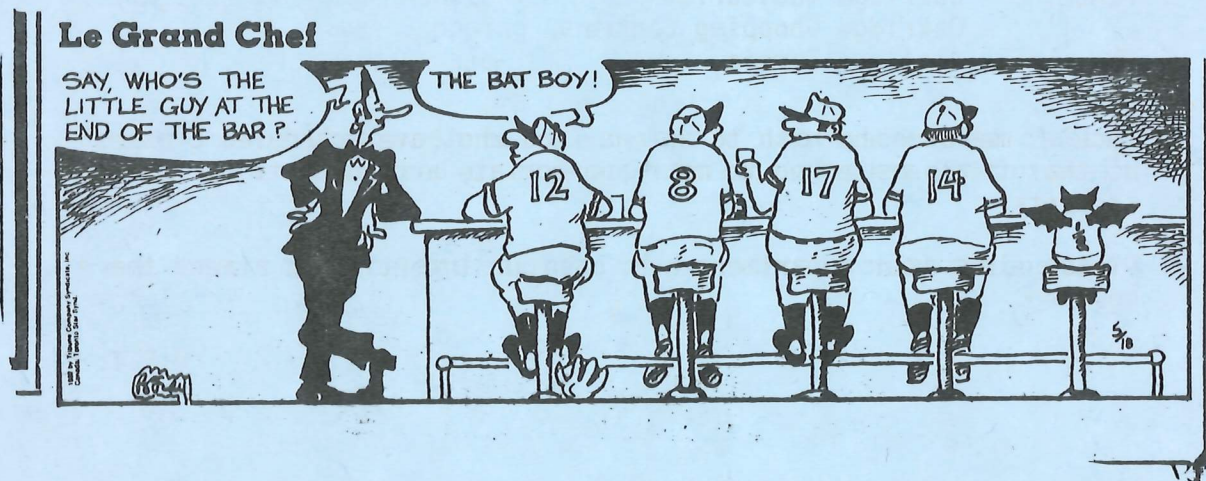
OUT TO LUNCH BUNCH 24

Good game, OUT TO LUNCH BUNCH.

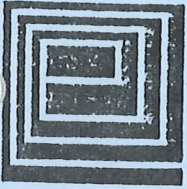
