#### Information Concerning Budget Reductions - Bulletin II

On Friday, 1982 July 30, Ministry of Education officials met with school superintendents and college chief executive officers to outline in person and in writing the budget reductions we will be required to implement for the remainder of the current fiscal year.

At Vancouver Community College we must reduce our operating budget by \$896,900.

This sum, while large in absolute terms, would represent approximately two percent of our annual budget if the reduction had been made on April Ol, the beginning of our fiscal year. If we are able to effect cost reductions by September Ol they will range between three and four percent of the balance of our budget.

Our College Board is required to submit a plan to the Ministry regarding our method of reduction. This plan is to be submitted preferably by August 31 and no later than September 15.

In order to meet this tight timetable certain actions have been and will be taken as follows:

- 1. All out of province travel is frozen immediately. Exceptions may be made only by the President.
- 2. College employees representing the various groups within the college will be invited to meet with the President on Thursday, August 05, to receive complete details of the Ministry's plans and directives.
- 3. The College Executive Committee will meet Tuesday, August 10, to consider recommendations to the Board for reductions based on the following Ministry priorities:
  - i) Reduction of non-salary items which will not reduce instruction.

- ii) Reduction in salary increases for the balance of the year. The College Executive Committee will not be proposing such action to any employee group until the Board has had the opportunity to consider the non-salary reductions and any differences between that reduction and the total required reduction (\$896,000).
- iii) Possible lay-offs. These require approval of the Minister. It is my strong hope we will not have to request such approval for Vancouver Community College.
- 4. The V.C.C. Board will meet Wednesday, August 11, to review the Ministry directives, the C.E.C. recommendations and consider its options.

We are facing a difficult period of belt tightening in Vancouver Community College. However, I believe that by sharing information and exchanging ideas we can maintain a strong educational enterprise worthy of our community.

As further developments unfold, I will endeavour to keep you informed.



of the Student Health Service. Surveys of the students show that many are not aware that they are entitled to use the free Student Health Service.


