COLLEGE BOARD MEETING

The November meeting of the College Board was held yesterday at the Mount Pleasant Centre which is part of King Edward Campus.

V.C.C. President A.S. Manera reported on a number of items that have transpired, some of which relate to this campus, including the anticipated shortfall in 1983-84 budget funds; K.E.C.'s Test of Oral Communication; Lower Mainland Co-operative Planning Group; and an up-date on the new facilities for K.E.C. on East Broadway. A copy of the President's report is in our library.

The Board approved a number of policies, several of which relate to that which is occurring at K.E.C.:

- two policies related to contract services,
- a policy on ancillary services,
- a policy related to the Board consultative process,
- two policies on student admissions, one is general and the other related to foreign students; and
- a policy on international education.

Several other items were on the agenda and appropriate action was taken. These, including the minutes of the previous meeting, are in the library.

In private session, among other items, the Board approved the purchase of a major piece of duplicating equipment (Xerox 9400) for the new campus. Also, the K.E.C. proposal for a Hospital Pharmacy Assistant program was approved for submission to the Ministry. On the other hand, the Board did not approve V.C.C.'s International Education Committee pursuing a contract respecting high school completion for young people from Hong Kong.

CHANGES IN THE COUNSELLING DEPARTMENT

Beginning November 29th, the Counselling Department will be going on an appointment system. Students will be given a definite time in which to see a counsellor. The appointments will normally be thirty minutes long, however, a counsellor or student can book more time if necessary. If at any time a counsellor is available, an appointment could be made immediately. If not, an appointment will be made for the student as soon as possible. Emergency situations will be accommodated. To make an appointment, call or contact the Counselling reception desk.

The Department will operate the same hours as before - from 9:00 a.m. to 7:30 p.m., Monday to Thursday, and from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on Friday.

We decided to change from our present drop-in system to an appointment system because of the ever increasing waiting time it takes for students who "drop-in" to see a counsellor. Students are currently waiting anywhere from thirty minutes to an hour and a half. The problem has increased over the past two years because of budget cuts and an increasing student enrollment.

Hopefully, the appointment system will help resolve some of the student frustration in having to wait so long to see a counsellor. It should also make it easier for students on restricted time schedules to obtain counselling services.

Another change in the operation of the Department will be the institution of orientation sessions for prospective students. The orientation sessions will be set up on a system similar to the Reading, Writing and Math Assessments with extra sessions around the registration periods. Hopefully, the group orientations will give the counsellors more time to work with students currently registered.

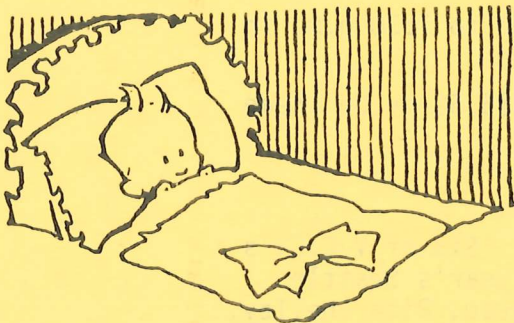
