COLLEGE BOARD MEETING

Last week Wednesday's College Board meeting was held at the Langara Campus. The chairman announced that the Vancouver School Board has appointed trustees Bill Brown and Bryan Hannay and former trustee Karl Erdman as members of the College Board, effective 1983 February 01.

The President's report to the Board touched on a number of K.E.C.-related items: additional "one-time only" funding of \$50,000 for part-time English Language Training; designation of adult special education as a provincial priority; enrollment - over 7,000 students enrolled in K.E.C. programs this month -; and the new campus - our move to East Broadway will be phased over a two-month period, from March 1st to May 6th. A copy of the report is in the library.

Mr. Manera's report to the Board on "1981/82 Financial Performance at V.C.C." in comparison with other colleges and institutes makes for interesting reading. (It's included with the agenda material.)

The 1983/84 Provisional (operating budget) Plan, developed by the College Executive Committee, was tabled with the Board. (The details appear on pages 15 to 24 of the agenda material.) Mr. Manera indicated that the provisional plan will be discussed on Thursday morning, January 20th, with representatives of the several College constituencies.

Background material, supporting documentation, minutes, etc., are in the library.

Several matters were handled in private session, two of which were:

- confirmation of appointment of faculty and staff; and

- awarding of the food services operation for the new K.E.C. to Domco Food Services Ltd.

The next two College Board meeting dates are February 9th and March 2nd.

These days were specified at that time as being December 23rd and February 18th.


Obviously, instructors who are not obliged to attend but, at the same time, cordially invited to do so, are those part-time instructors who are not scheduled to instruct on February 18th.

WE'RE ON THE MOVE

As you know, King Edward Day is scheduled for Friday, February 18th. This year's activities are being scheduled for this campus (morning through to noon hour) and the new King Edward Campus on East Broadway. 1) The President Looks Ahead

This will be followed by a question and answer period.

other related activities.

There will be a question and answer period.

3) <u>Lunch</u>

Domco Foodservices will demonstrate their culinary capabilities with a catered lunch. Tickets for the lunch, at \$5 each, will be available between February 2nd and February 11th from the cashier at King Edward Campus. No tickets will be available on the day.

Get your luncheon tickets early as the caterer needs to know the numbers a week in advance. The more tickets that are sold, the better the luncheon will be.

A sumptuous buffet, made up of two entrees, cold cuts, salads and desserts, is promised.

This will be another great opportunity to sit down with colleagues old and new.

4) Tours of the New Campus

Arrangements are being made to visit the instructional area of the new campus in the afternoon. They will be made on a departmental basis. This will give you an opportunity to explore your department's area, your classroom and your office, and to locate ancilliary services so that you can inform your students of what to expect before you and they make the big move.


