COLLEGE BOARD MEETING

The regular meeting of the Vancouver Community College Board met yesterday evening with a large number of college faculty, staff, students and administrators being present. Chairman Peter Hebb's preliminary comments addressed the major items on the Board's agenda: tuition fees and the budget plan.

The Board moved into committee-of-the-whole to hear several delegations:

Langara Student Society V.V.I. Student Society V.I.A. E.L.T. Instructors V.M.R.E.U.

Both student presentations dealt with tuition fees, arguing that the tuition fees being recommended were excessive. The spokesman for Langara students indicated the tuition fee increase should be guided by the federal government's 6 and 5 limits. Additionally, the V.V.I. student spokesman argued that the proposed bylaw change (regarding 90 days' notice) should not be approved.

The V.I.A.'s brief was presented by President Dennis O'Neill; a copy of the brief has been placed in the library. Geoffrey Flack addressed the Board on behalf of E.L.T. instructors teaching in the half-time program. His presentation was an elaboration of the instructors' letter to the Board.

Steve Baker, on behalf of the V.M.R.E.U., addressed the Board on support staff cut-backs/lay-offs.

From the several briefs presented, the Board took immediate action to investigate the possibility of including the cost of textbooks, materials costs, etc., as income tax deductible items.

As indicated above, the significant item of business related to tuition fees and the budget plan. College President A.S. Manera presented the 83-84 plan and suggestions respecting fee increases. After lengthy discussion - some of it rather heated - motions were passed to:

- a) increase tuition fees for full-time students in credit courses and programs from \$200 per term, or \$48 per month, to \$215, or \$52 per month, respectively, as appropriate to each program (approximately an 8% increase);
- b) increase tuition fees for all arts and sciences courses (Langara) and for part-time career students (including K.E.C.'s music students) from \$40 per course to \$60 per course;
- c) approve the tuition fee structure and expense plan as outlined, with

the proviso that the increased tuition fee revenue generated from b) above be distributed as follows: 65% to Langara and 35% to the other campuses; and

d) approve the list of reductions as listed and as appropriately amended to reflect the tuition fee increase and the revised distribution, as noted in c) above.

Several other items of business required Board action, one of which was the establishment of the V.C.C. Foundation (for fund-raising purposes). Mrs. Jarvis, Messrs. Lee and Pearkes were appointed as founding members.

A copy of the minutes of the Board meeting of 1983 February 09, the President's Report, agenda material, briefs, etc., have been placed in the library for your perusal.


