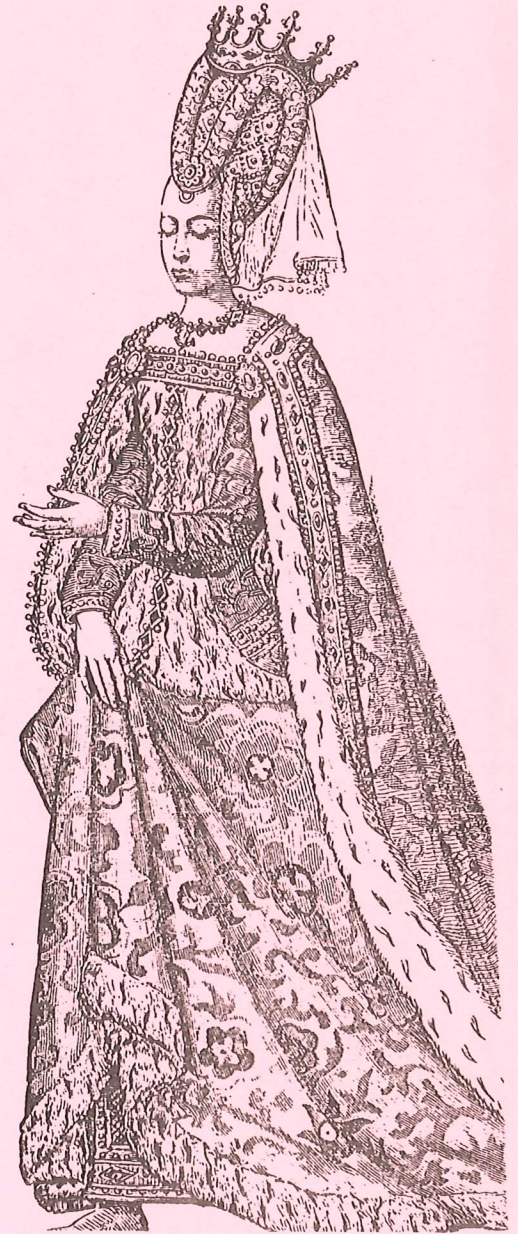
THE ROYAL VISIT
