If you have any discard material that may be useful (see list below), see Gordon Pawelchak, who will coordinate the storage for OXFAM.

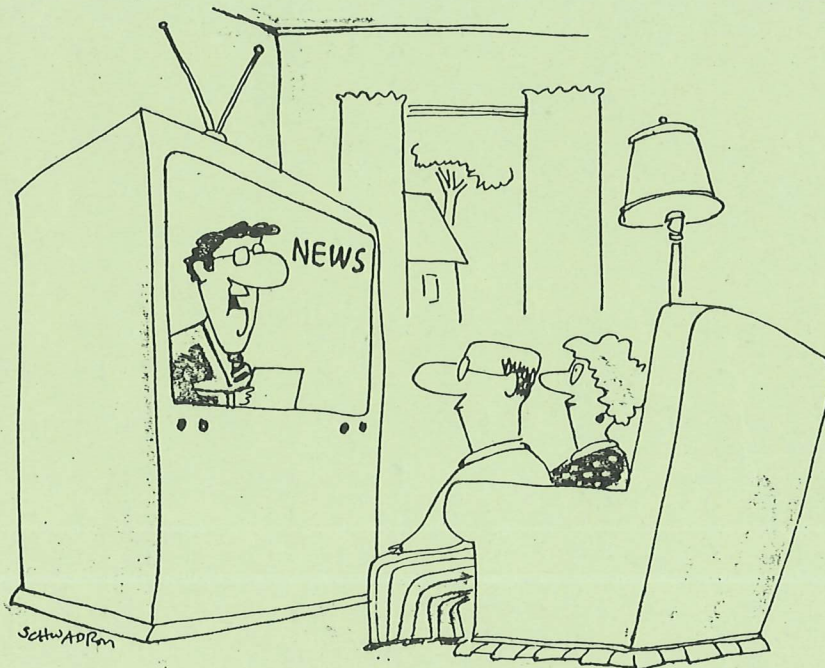
