

ENGLISH PLACEMENT TESTS

This is the last EPT under the Ministry of Education contract and, although the EPT will be continuing, there will be certain changes in procedures.

The next EPT scheduled will be <u>July 5th (Tuesday)</u>, <u>1983</u>. Several changes should be noted and passed on to any interested students:

- 1) Pre-registration is required. Forms for the July sitting are available from ERIBC in May. Closing date for registration is June 15th.
- 2) A fee will be charged and payment must accompany registration. Students attending the public administrations of the EPT in July, November or March will pay \$15.00. Charges during the registration sittings will be \$20.00 per test, as it will be necessary to maintain a core of markers without being certain of numbers of students to be accommodated.

Scheduling of the EPT will be forthcoming.

LIBRARY UPDATE

The date for the move to the new campus is still aimed at the week of 11th - 18th April. Subject to change only in the possibility of that date being set back, the following are our plans:

The library WILL BE CLOSED FOR ONE WEEK ONLY. We aim to close on Friday, 8th April at our present location, and reopen for business as usual on Monday, 18th April at the new location.

FILMS which have been previously booked will be available during the week 11th to 15th April (pickup and drop off spots will be arranged with the instructors concerned). No other library service will be available during that week.

AFTER THE MOVE, and commencing immediately at the new location, some NEW ROUTINES will be inaugerated. A SECURITY SYSTEM, similar to the one in use at Langara and V.V.I. will mean that library staff should no longer have to check bags as students leave the library.

I.D. CARDS must be presented before an item can be borrowed from the library, although any item can continue to be used inside the library.

STUDY SEATING will be increased from about 40 to 150 places. The AUDIO ACTIVE LAB will continue to be available for individual student use (there may be a few days delay for servicing and reinstallation of Audio equipment during the move.)

DURING APRIL/MAY, and according to need, there WILL be some kind of Courier service between the old and the new locations, to service those whose scheduled move is earlier or later than the library.

PLEASE THINK AHEAD. Get requests in early if you know what will be needed, so that the library staff can plan for your requirements ahead of the move.
