LIBRARY UPDATE

The Library is now open and running again. Please note the new hours open:

Monday	9:00 a.m. to 8:30 p.m.
Tuesday	9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
Wednesday	9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
Thursday	9:00 a.m. to 8:30 p.m.
Friday	9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

These hours will continue until September, at which time we hope to be able to increase to evening opening for Tuesday and Wednesday.

LIBRARY TOURS AND ORIENTATION:

We intend to organize regular orientation sessions, in addition to special orientation for faculty later in the summer.

Meanwhile, we will accept bookings for class visits during normal library hours. PLEASE BOOK AHEAD OF TIME. The demand for the next few weeks is likely to be heavy, so don't be disappointed by failing to book beforehand. Book in person, or call extension 205.

FILM BOOKING:

Since K.E.C. Library does not open until 9:00 a.m., and since Langara Library are on considerably reduced hours for the summer, please allow plenty of time for film pickup when you book films for class use.

ENTRANCE AND EXIT DOORS:

Please note that, although we have a proliferation of Fire Doors and Emergency Doors, the only authorized door to enter or leave the Library is the one at the checkout counter, level 2 ("downstairs"). Eventually there will be an additional door for faculty use at level 3, by way of Curriculum Development into the Professional Development Library.

STUDENT HEALTH SERVICES IS ALIVE AND WELL AT THE NEW CAMPUS.....

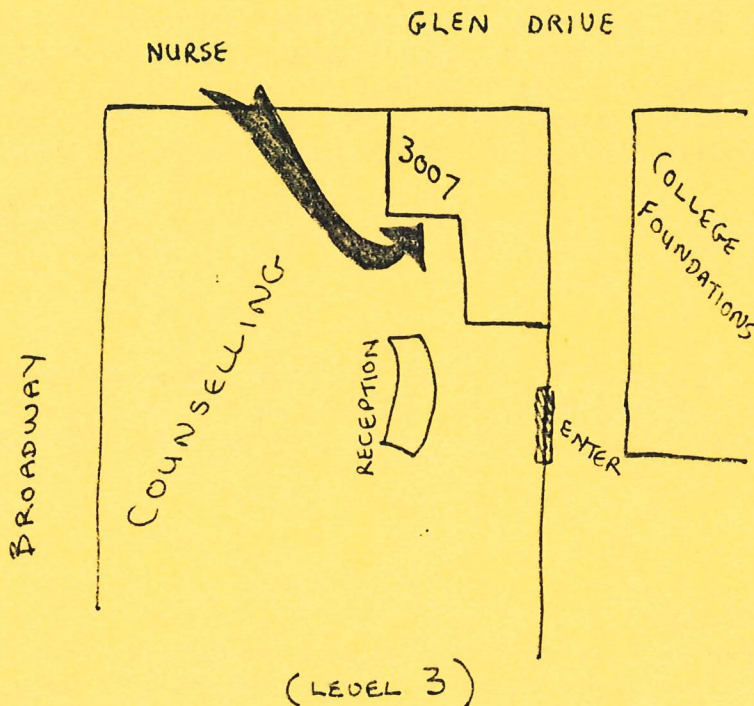

ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS

Several problems/concerns/complaints regarding the new campus are recurrent and deserve comment. Mr. Robert Gauthier has provided the following notes for your information.

1. The on-going construction and the state of the adjacent grounds are conducive to much dust and dirt in our midst. The cleaning staff are attempting to cope with the situation and a more effective use of personnel may be a partial solution. Should an area appear to have been neglected, please advise your department head who will contact the Building Services Manager, Mr. J. Humble.
2. The air-conditioning system will become fully effective only after we are in full possession of all levels of the building. K. D. Engineering are attempting to balance the flow of air and will continue their efforts in this regard.
3. External windows have been measured and bids to curtain the building will be received soon. The work should be underway shortly thereafter.
4. The cafeteria, when fully functional, will operate Mondays through Fridays, from 8:00 in the morning until 9:00 at night. The contract with Domco Food Services stipulates that food not be vended in the machines located in the student lounges. Coffee cannot be vended in these lounges because they lack plumbing connections. Problems associated with the vending machines should be referred to Mr. J. Humble, pending the arrival on campus of Domco personnel.

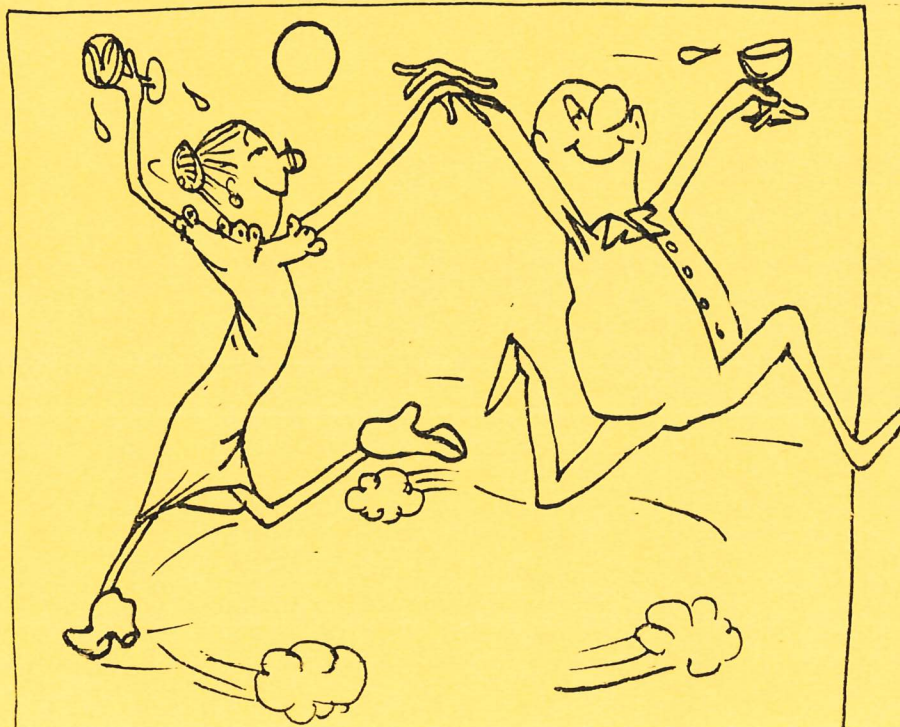
