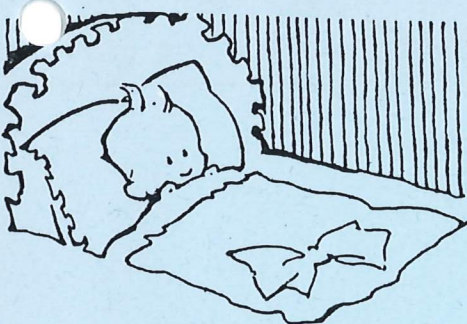

Persons having teaching and/or marking experience in senior secondary or first-year post-secondary English courses within the last two years are invited to apply in writing, briefly stating their relevant university training and teaching experience. Applicants who have participated in EPT marking sessions previously should so indicate.

Marking will take place on the above noted dates and markers must agree to be present for all six sessions. Marking Centres will be located in Vancouver, the Fraser Valley, Victoria, and Kamloops. Please state your location preference in your application together with a telephone number at which you can be reached.

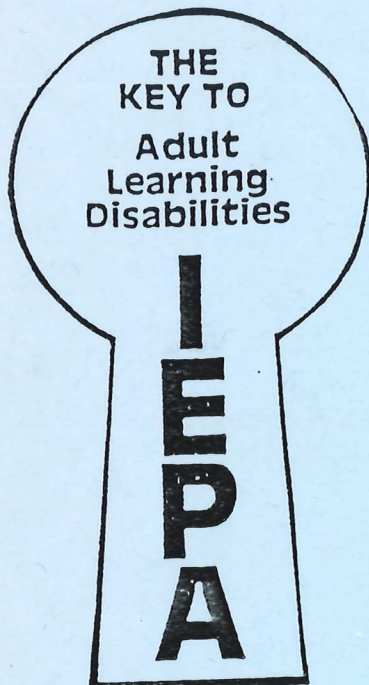
