COLLEGE BOARD MEETING

The last meeting of the 1983-84 Board met last week Thursday and the inaugural meeting of the 1984-85 Board is tentatively set for 1984 February 15.

President A.S. Manera's report to the Board covered the following subjects:

- United Way, 1983
- Distance Education
- Ministry review of the College's Five-Year Plan

The Board heard a report from Board member John Pearkes on the VCC Educational Foundation which has been established to raise funds on behalf of the College for a variety of "one-time only" projects. Mr. Pearkes is the chairman of the Foundation; members for that Board are being appointed and there is an expectation that soliciting of funds will get underway very shortly.

Two RFC's (temporary funded courses) were approved, the first for Auto Body Repair and the second, for English Language Training.

Since the Totem Conference Lottery was not able to raise sufficient moneys to fund VCC Totem Conference athletic teams, the College Board agreed that the expenditure of up to \$25,000 (in addition to the funds raised by the lottery) would be allowed.

As its final act, the Board moved unanimously a vote of thanks to instructors, staff and administrators for their dedicated work in the 1983-84 year.

In private session, the Board, after rescinding the motion of November 23rd, approved a motion that employees who had withdrawn their services on Thursday, November 10th, would not suffer loss of pay for the statutory holiday falling on November 11th.

Minutes of the public meeting of November 23rd, agenda and documentation of Thursday's meeting, and the President's Report has been placed in the library.

Pre-registration will be enforced. Applicants must submit their completed registration forms, together with their \$15.00 fee, directly to ERIBC (Educational Research Institute of British Columbia) prior to Friday, March 2nd. Forms are not yet on hand - you will be informed as to when they are available.

Late registrants (or those unable to attend the test and who advise ERIBC of the fact prior to test time) will be referred to the July 10th (Langara) sitting. Students who plan to be away in March should ensure that they do not miss the July EPT, as this will be the last opportunity to write prior to the fall intake in post-secondary institutions.

Please tell your students that completion of the EPT is mandatory for all students entering post-secondary programs (which have English Components) in British Columbia. The EPT score has no effect upon admission itself.

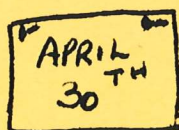

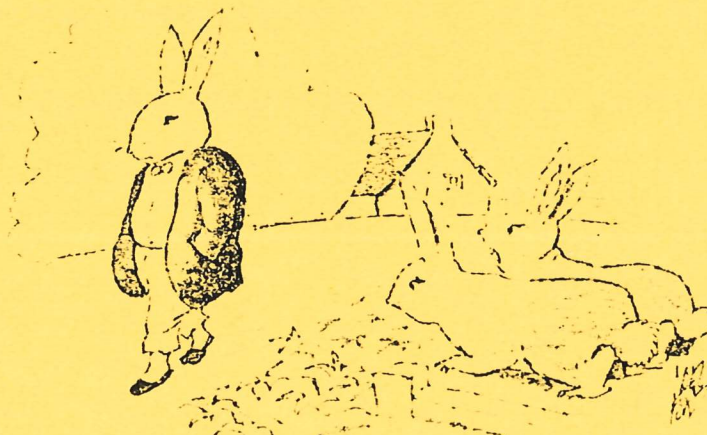
