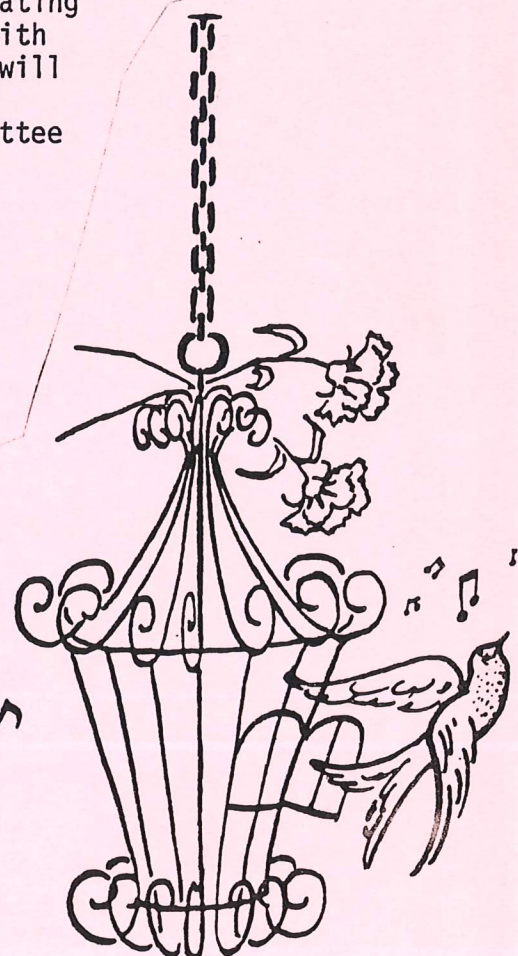

On Friday, May 4th, Dr. John Roueche, noted lecturer and author on community college issues, will be at KING EDWARD CAMPUS to meet and work with faculty, administrators and board trustees of VCC, BCIT, Capilano and Douglas Colleges.

Dr. Roueche has written over 200 books, articles and monographs on college education and has spoken to over 900 colleges and universities since 1970, including several in Alberta and Ontario, and has twice addressed the ACCC and the Canadian Adult Education Association. His more recent books include Holistic Literacy in College Teaching (1980), A New Look at Successful Programs for Low-Achieving Students (1983) and Beacons for Change: An Innovative Outcome Model for Community Colleges (1983). Last year, he received the Outstanding Learned Article Award from the U.S. Education Press Association and has several Teaching Excellence awards among his numerous citations.

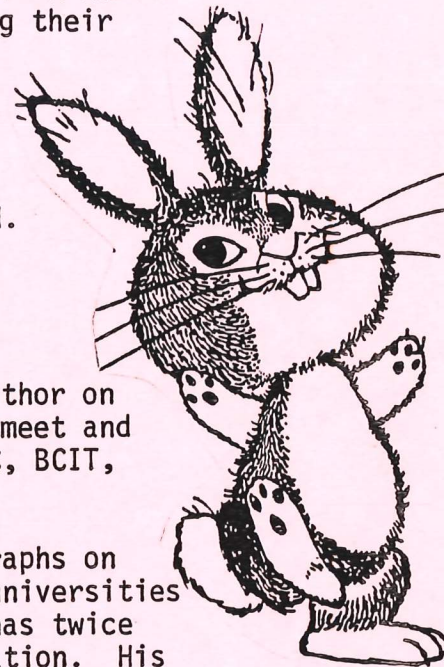

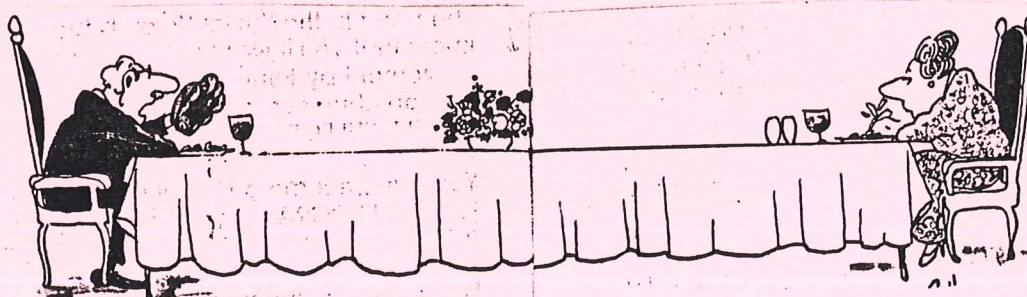
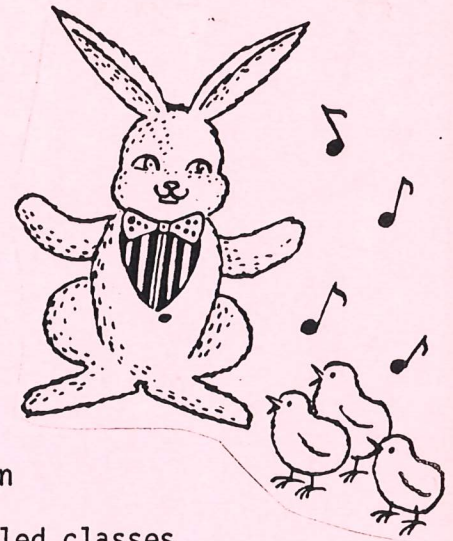
COMMUNICATIONS!!!

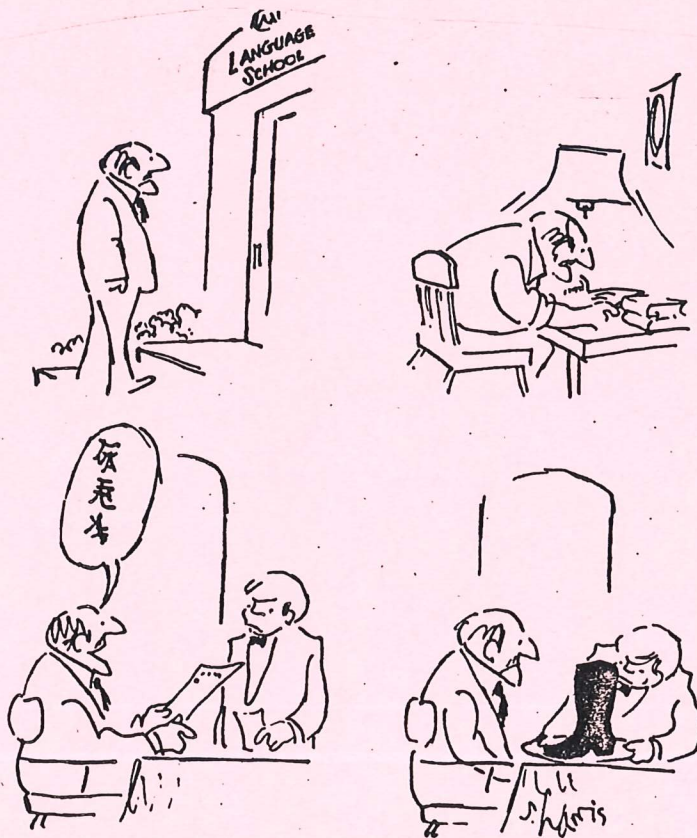
