We are not buying any used books at this time. Please inform your students of this.

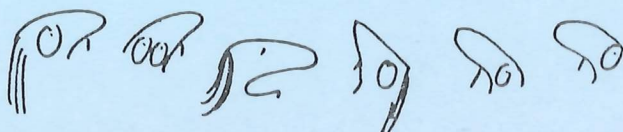

SPECIAL NOTICE TO STUDENTS

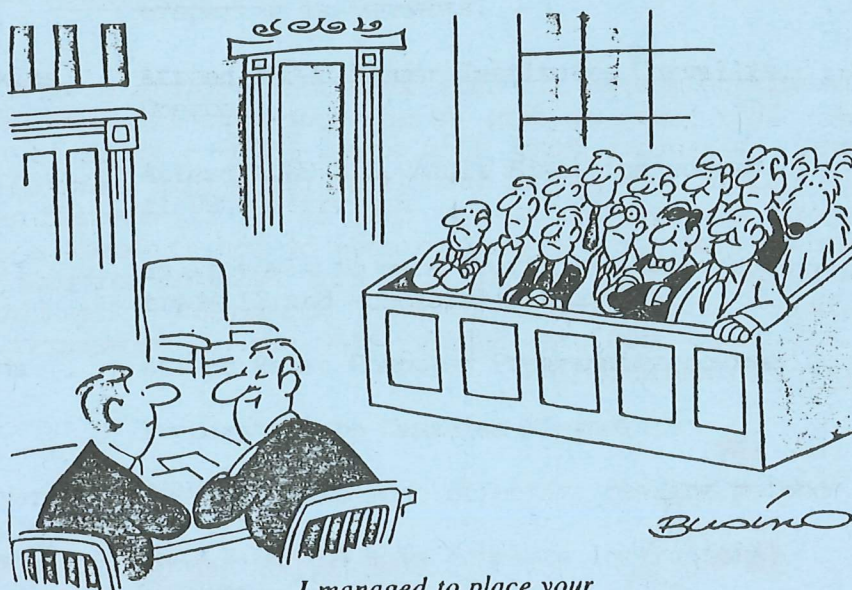

VOC/VVI requires a Telephone Operator/Receptionist. Closing date for applications is July 10, 1984.

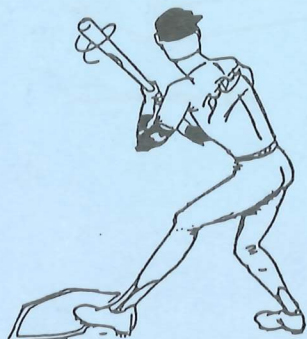
