NOTICE TO ALL STUDENTS AND FACULTY

The King Edward Campus Student Society has been inactive since the former executive resigned in the spring of this year. The Dean of Administrative and Student Services has been encouraging an advisory committee of students to assist in planning student activities on Campus. This group met recently and discussed ways and means of accessing the funds held in K.E.C.S.A. Trust Accounts (approximately \$40,000). If these funds are not claimed, they will revert to the Provincial government. It was proposed that an election be held to re-constitute the K.E.C.S.A. executive. The purpose would be two-fold:

- 1. Vote to transfer existing funds held in K.E.C.S.A. Trust Accounts to the VCC-Foundation. These dollars could be doubled by a matching grant from the Vancouver Foundation and all accrued interest would be designated for K.E.C. student aid.
- 2. Officially terminate the K.E.C.S.A. The existing constitution has no "wind-down" clause.

The elections by-law of the K.E.C.S.A. constitution creates a "Catch-22" situation in so far as it requires that posters announcing upcoming elections be posted two weeks prior to the opening of nominations, and that general elections for all positions be held during the month of October. In an effort to comply with the spirit, if not the letter of the constitution, notices have been posted and the election date has been set for October 31st. Nominations for positions will be open until 5:00 p.m. Friday, October 26th.

Instructors are urged to direct student attention to the posted election information.


TEACHING POST IN CHINA

TRAIN THE TRAINER

The Train the Trainer Program offers four courses in instructor training. The program emphasizes practical 'hands-on' approach to instructor training and provides the knowledge, skills and experiences to successfully plan, design, prepare and manage training sessions.

The four courses within the program are: Program Design (30 hours), Giving of Instruction (30 hours), Evaluation of Learning (30 hours), and Practicum (30 hours maximum tutorial).

A College certificate is awarded to graduates who successfully complete the 120 hour program.

Courses 1517, 1518, and 1519 may be taken in any sequence.


