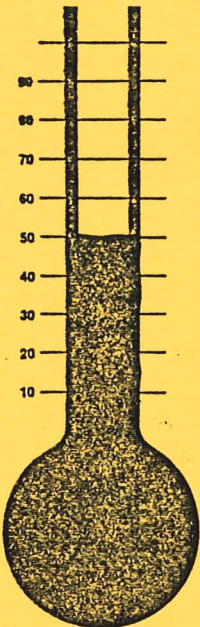
KEC Personnel - you've broken all records and made this the most successful year ever! Thank you, once again, for your generous support which made all this possible.

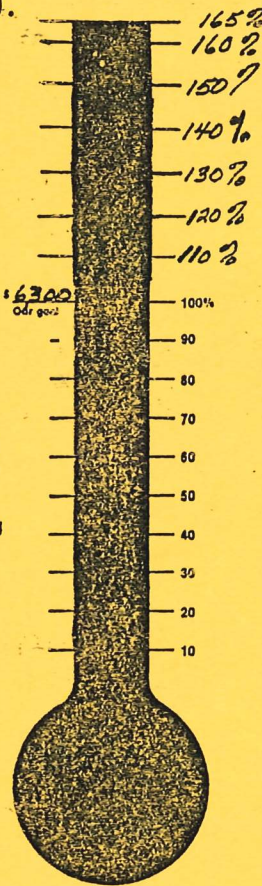

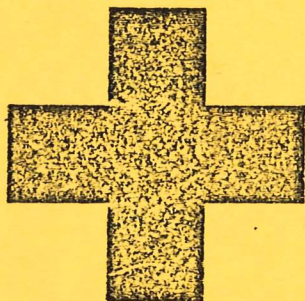

GUIDELINE TO DONOR ELIGIBILITY

Final decision and responsibility for donation rests with the Nurse-in-charge.

Donors are requested to have a small meal before donating.

AGE - 17 until 65 (up to 66th birthday). First time donors at 60 may be restricted.

WEIGHT - 100 lbs.

PERMANENT DEFERRALS

Jaundice	History of Hepatitis	Hypertension
Stroke	Emphysema	Chronic Bronchitis
Thrombophlebitis	Epilepsy	Diabetes
Cancer	Thyroid Disease	
Drug Addicts -	with evidence of intravenous infection	
Undulant Fever		

DEFERRALS

RABIES VACCINE - 12 months

TRANSFUSION OF BLOOD - 6 months (maybe longer when cause of transfusion considered)

INFECTIOUS MONONUCLEOSIS - 6 months after full clinical recovery

SURGERY - deferral depends on specific operation, 6 months or more if major and 3 months or more if minor

TUBERCULOSIS - 3 months deferral after full recovery and if not on medication

RUBELLA IMMUNIZATION - 3 months

ILLNESS OR INJURY - 3 weeks to 3 months or more depending if minor or major incident and if not on medication

CONTACT WITH COMMUNICABLE DISEASES - 6 weeks to 3 months after recovery

INOCULATIONS - B.C.G. - 4 weeks - diphtheria, tetanus, typhoid - 3 weeks

ALLERGIES - defer until free of symptoms - 7 days after allergy shot

UPPER RESPIRATORY INFECTIONS - cold, flu - one week after recovery

PREGNANT - 6 months after birth.

EAR PIERCING - 6 months

FROM THE BOOKSTORE

Used Books - The Bookstore is continuing in its efforts to provide a used-book service for KEC students. A used-book broker will be at the Bookstore on Wednesday, December 12 from 10:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. to buy books from the students.

Instructors concerned about the high cost of textbooks should encourage their students to participate. The greater the involvement we have in this program now, the better the selection of used books will be for students starting in January. Of course, present students benefit by having a hassle-free system in which they receive cash for their books immediately. Instructors who are changing textbooks next term should inform their students of this. The broker will provide the last opportunity for these students to sell their books.

Some details to pass on to the students: - Books will be bought at 50% of the new book price until the Bookstore requirements are obtained. After that, prices offered will be wholesale prices. Wholesale prices are dependent on the age and demand for the book. The earlier the students bring in their books, the better their chances will be of getting top dollar for their books.

-Any current textbooks from any college will be accepted (paperbacks excluded).

-The broker will be at King Edward ONE DAY ONLY. Students unable to part with their books Wednesday, may obtain the same service Thursday at Langara.

Please note - this program has been explained to the K.E.C. Student Advisory Committee. They have concluded it is an equitable arrangement and have offered their support. I do hope instructors will relay this information.
