POLICY:

A.1. In the interest of security of persons and property, King Edward Campus, Vancouver Community College shall maintain a twenty-four hour, seven days a week security surveillance.

#### PROCEDURES:

- B.1 During the work day from 08:30 to 17:00 hours, Security personnel can be contacted at local 204 or the campus Switchboard Operator -"0".
- B.1.1 After 17:00 hours, Monday to Thursday, Security personnel can be contacted at local 208 - the Counselling switchboard or at local 705 - the Admissions and Records desk.
- B.1.2 After 19:30 hours, Monday to Thursday, Security personnel can be contacted at local 200 - the Continuing Education switchboard.
- B.2 After 17:00 hours, on Friday, Security personnel can be contacted at local 723 - the desk of the administrator on duty.
- B.3 Prior notification should be given to Security that entry is desired for other than regular hours (08:00 - 22:00 hours). Security will arrange to have a guard available at a specified door to admit that person.
- If it is not possible to give prior notification, those wishing to B.3.1 gain entry to the building should telephone the voice pager at 667-2638, identify themselves and state the time and door at which entrance is required. A guard will then be available to open the door on production of satisfactory identification - V.C.C. identification card, which displays your photograph.

#### POLICY:

The mounting or affixing of signs - both temporary and permanent -A.1 shall be in accordance with "King Edward Campus Guidelines for the Mounting and Affixing of Signs", as noted hereunder.

#### PROCEDURES:

# King Edward Campus Guidelines for the Mounting and Affixing of Signs

- In order to be posted on campus notice boards, permanent and temporary B.1 signs must bear the approval of the Dean of Administrative and Student Services or his delegate.
- When it is determined that a permanent sign is required, the division B.2 chairman, department head or program/service coordinator will forward the request to the Building Services Manager who with the approval of the Dean of Administrative and Student Services or his delegate shall undertake to have the requested sign placed.
- Permanent signs designating the function of an area or a room shall be B.2.1 suspended from the ceiling in proximity to the appropriate doorway(s) or affixed to the wall above the appropriate doorway(s).
- Signs identifying office occupants and their hours shall be located B.2.2 adjacent to the appropriate office doorway(s).
- Notice Boards will be strategically located throughout the campus to B.3 accommodate temporary signs and notices.
- When it is determined that a temporary sign is required, the division B.3.1 chairman, department head or program/service coordinator will forward the request to the Building Service Manager who with the approval of the Dean of Administrative and Student Services or his delegate shall undertake to have the requested sign placed.
- Normally, temporary signs shall not be placed on walls, doors or B.3.2 windows.



In a year that brought much economic bad news to educational institutions, VCC closed out 1984 on a happy note. Since its start last spring, the Vancouver Community College Educational Foundation raised \$68,900. This money came from the business community, from those at the college, and from friends outside. Particularly generous was a gift of \$21,044.39 from the King Edward Campus Students Association. These funds, along with money from previously established trust funds, created and endowment fund which is administered by the Vancouver Foundation. The foundation has agreed to match \$100,000 of the 1984 money and it will match a further \$100,000 in 1985 and 1986. This money will go to student bursaries and toward the acquisition of new learning resources.

Recently released figures from the Ministry of Education indicate that in 1983-1984, VCC delivered 20% of the instruction in the province's college system, with 16.3% of the system's dollars. Total unit costs at the college were 78.2% of the average for the rest of the system and our administrative costs were only 59% of the provincial average.

In early December Vancouver Community College signed an agreement to exchange students with the University of East Asia in Macau. Under the agreement credits can be transferred between the two institutions. This is another step forward in the college's efforts in the sphere of international education.

The Chaim Zbar Foundation has given a \$500 bursary to benefit students in Vancouver Vocational Institute's dental assisting program. Mr. Zbar has done this in honour of his daughter, who was a student in the program.

Will you still be paying Christmas bills when the trees are coming into leaf and flowers begin to bloom? You can start on the road to recovery Wednesday, January 20 by attending An Introduction to Personal Financial Planning. Offered by Continuing Education King Edward Campus and running from 7:00-10:00 p.m., this course is designed to help you build a solid financial program from the ground up. 
