HANDIPERSON YOUTH TRAINING PROGRAM

Rumors that the Handiperson Youth Training Option Program has approval and will begin at KEC are true. The start date is February 18th. Applications and interviews can be arranged now; so, if you are aware of qualified and interested individuals you may wish to pass on some of the more pertinent information.

The 37 week Handiperson certificate program is designed to aid youth either in transition from school to work or for additional formal education or training. Usually employers do not express interest in hiring young people who have no work experience. The Handiperson program combines training in the workplace and in the classroom, so that graduates will obtain both theoretical knowledge and practical on-the-job training and experience.

Qualified trainees may receive a weekly training allowance from Canada Employment and Immigration Commission, or U.I.C.

Admission requirements are:

- . aged 17-21 and a Canadian Citizen or permanent resident (landed immigrant);
- . unemployed and out of school for at least 3 months but less than 2 years; not a post secondary graduate;
- out of full-time work for 26 or more consecutive weeks in the previous 52 weeks;
- . able to read, write, do arithmetic, and communicate well in English (assessments may be required);
- . mature, motivated and able to work independently or in a group (reference desirable);
- . able to and will attend full-time, 4 days a week for the 37 weeks of the program;
- . willing to learn new job skills with the goal of exploring both a career and a change of lifestyle if necessary.

The twenty-five weeks of the training, provided by training hosts, combine work experience drawn from areas such as: 1) operating engineer's helper; 2) security guard's helper; 3) cleaner's helper; 4) landscape maintenance helper; 5) mover's helper; 6) tool room helper; 7) cafeteria and food service helper; 8) laundry helper; 9) mailroom helper; 10) office helper.

The other twelve weeks will be spent on campus.

More details of each of the training areas, and of KEC's Handiperson Youth Training Option Program, will be available in the Counselling Career Centre.

The following was printed in KEC Times in 1984:

Cutbacks in Janitorial Services 1984-85

We have been advised by V.C.C. Administration that as a result of a reduced 1984-85 budget, it will be necessary to cut back Janitorial Services at your Campus.

The following schedule adjustments will take effect immediately:

- 1. No reduction of services in Washrooms.
- 2. Automotive, Autobody and Diesel Shops to be swept once per week degreasing on request at extra cost.
- 3. Classrooms dust wiped or vacuumed three days per week blackboards weekly, garbage collected daily.
- 4. Offices vacuumed or dust mopped three days per week, garbage collected daily.
- 5. Library vacuumed three days per week.
- 6. Hallways swept nightly, damp wiped two days per week.

It is hoped that with the co-operation of staff, faculty and of course the students, the effects of the reduced services will not be too obvious.
